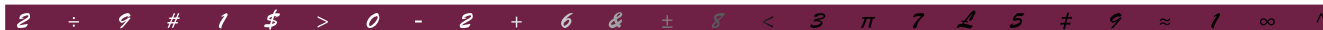

Household Spending in Yukon 2012

Highlights:

- Yukon households spent an average of \$62,903 on goods and services in 2012, up 24.2% compared to the previous Survey of Household Spending (SHS) in 2009 (\$50,649).
- Average spending on shelter accounted for the largest share of this total at 26.1%; followed by transportation at 21.2%, food at 13.8% and recreation at 9.9%.
- Of the **total** household expenditure (\$86,958) of Yukoners, current consumption expenditures (\$62,903) accounted for 72.3%, personal taxes (\$16,081) accounted for 18.5%, personal insurance payments and pension contributions (\$5,814) accounted for 6.7%, and gifts of money and contributions (\$2,160) accounted for 2.5%.

Note to Readers

This report presents the results of the 2012 Survey of Household Spending (SHS), conducted by Statistics Canada during January through March 2013 in Yukon. Information was gathered about the spending habits, dwelling characteristics and household equipment of Yukon households. During personal interviews, data were obtained directly from respondents who were asked to recall their expenditures over the previous 12-month period.

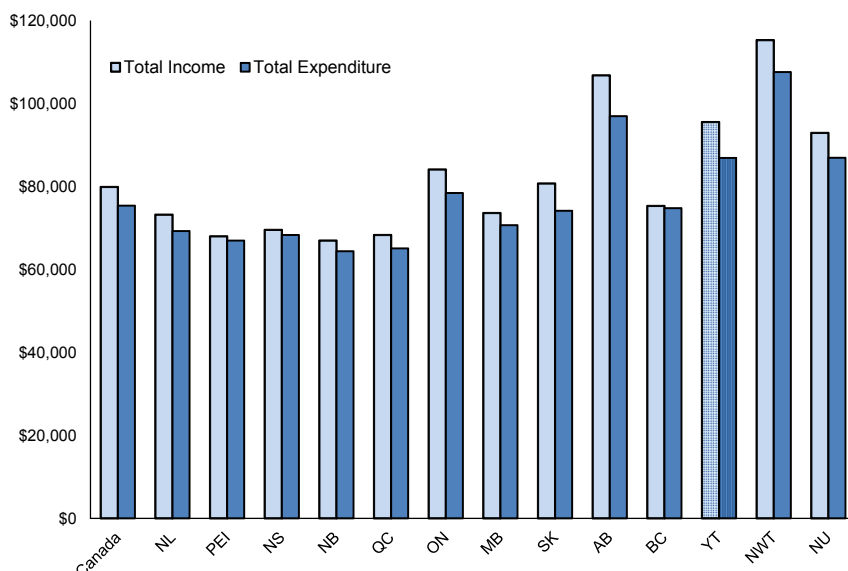
The report focuses on spending patterns in Yukon as well as provides some comparisons with Canada and other Canadian jurisdictions. As the 2012 questionnaire in the territories was different compared to that used in the provinces (recall as well as daily expenditures diary), figures in this report are not strictly comparable amongst jurisdictions. In addition, Canadian figures no longer include any territorial data. [See endnotes on page 16]

The SHS is conducted annually in the provinces, while in the territories it is conducted every two years (with the exception of 2012) in order to reduce the response burden on the territories' small population base.

Average Household Income and Total Expenditures, Canada, Provinces and Territories, 2012

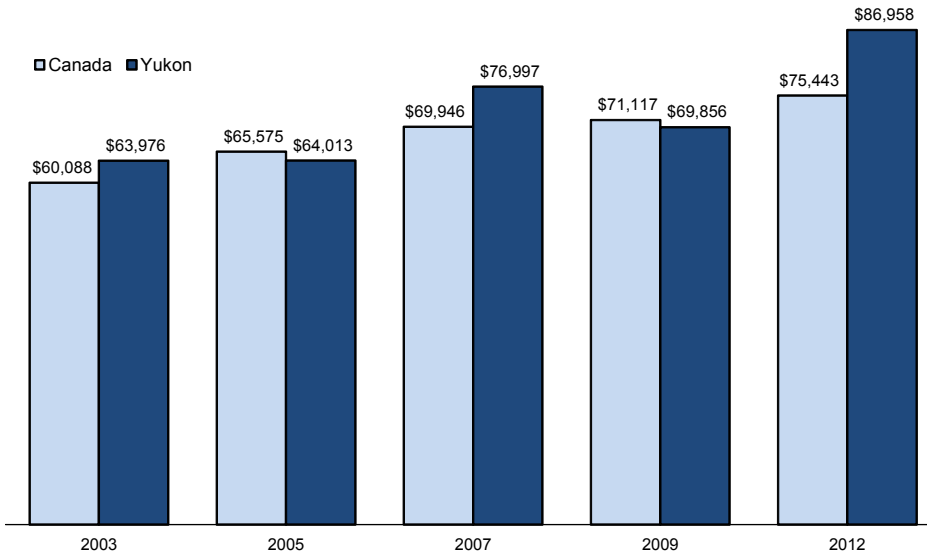


In 2012, the average household income (before tax) reported by Yukon households was \$95,583; the third highest in Canada, following the Northwest Territories (\$115,363) and Alberta (\$106,846). New Brunswick had the lowest household income at \$67,030 in 2012.

Yukon ranked fourth highest in average **total** household expenditure (\$86,958) in 2012. The Northwest Territories had the highest average expenditure at \$107,641, while New Brunswick had the lowest average expenditure at \$64,443. The average total expenditure in Canada (not including the territories) was \$75,443.

Average Total Household Expenditure, Canada and Yukon, 2003-2012



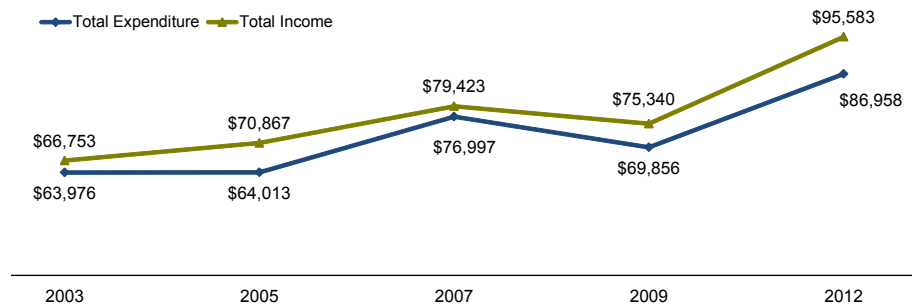
In 2012, the average **total** household expenditure reported by Yukon households (\$86,958) was \$11,515, or 15.3%, higher than the average total expenditure for Canada (\$75,443).

Compared to the previous SHS for 2009 in Yukon, the average **total** household expenditure (\$86,958) increased by \$17,102, or 24.5%. (When adjusted for inflation over the same period, the increase was 18.3%.)

Average Total Household Expenditure and Income (before tax), Yukon, 2003 to 2012

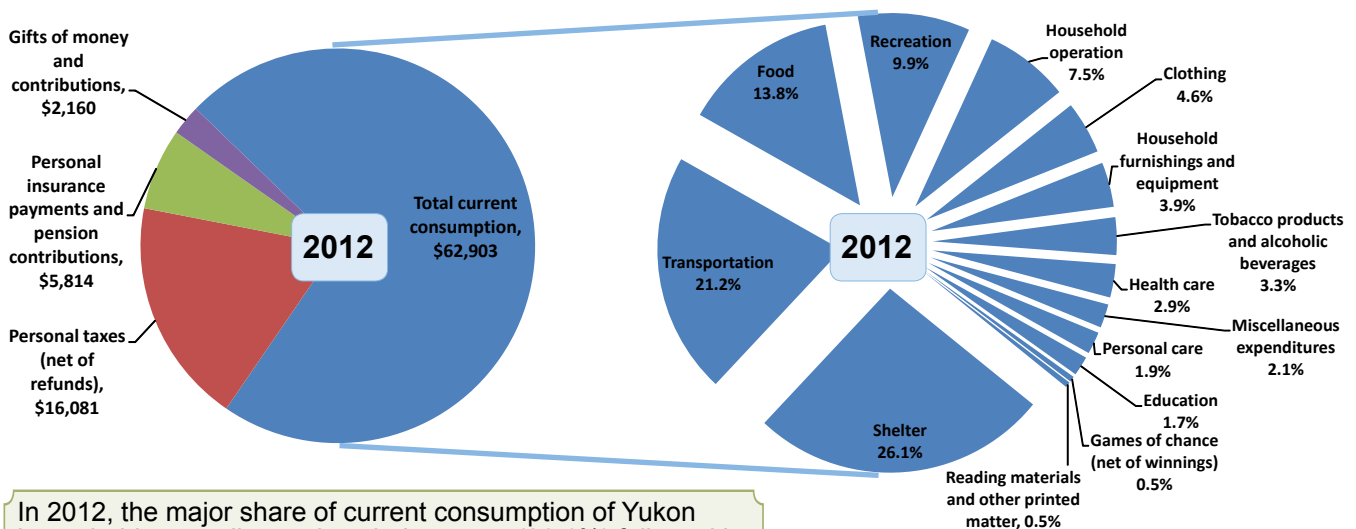
In 2012, the average household income reported by Yukon households was \$95,583, while the average **total** household expenditure was \$86,958; 91.0% of the average household income. This translates to an average surplus of \$8,625 per household.



In 2009, the average **total** household expenditure (\$69,856) was 92.7% of the average household income (\$75,340).

Share of Total Current Consumption, Yukon, 2012

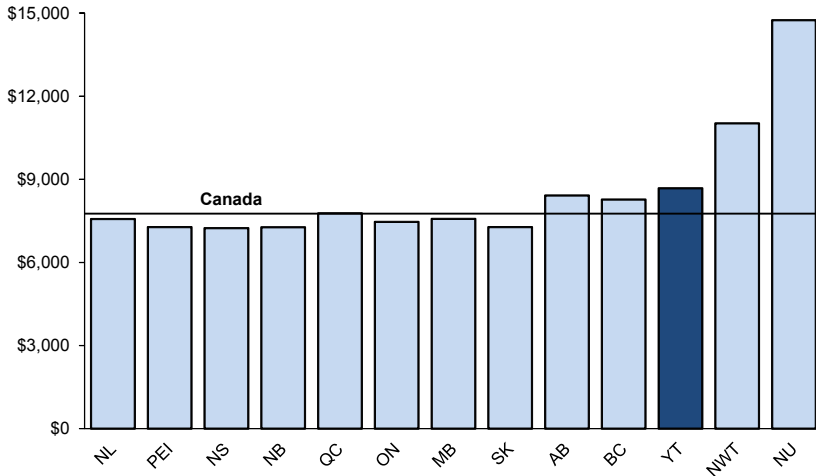


In 2012, the major share of current consumption of Yukon households was allocated to shelter costs (26.1%) followed by transportation (21.2%), food (13.8%) and recreation (9.9%).

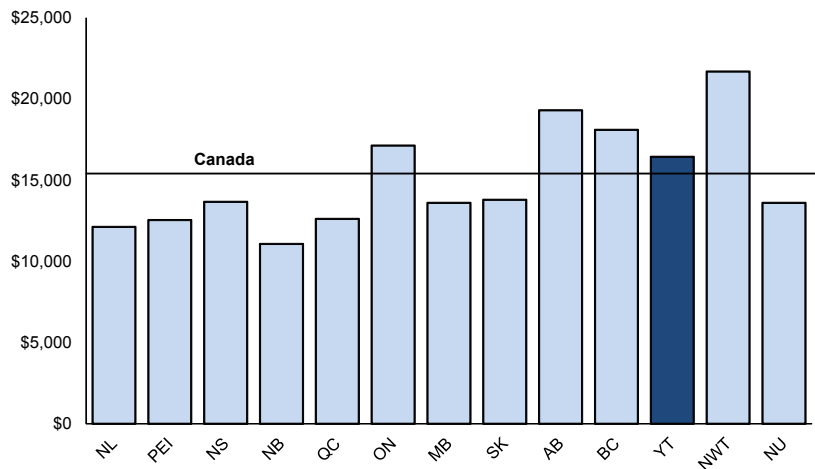
Average Spending on Food, 2012



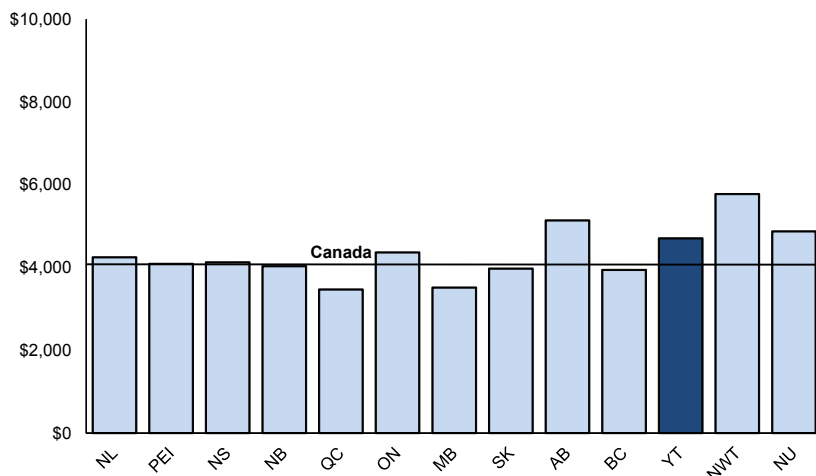
In 2012, the average expenditure of Yukon households on food was \$8,678, up \$1,182, or 15.8%, over 2009. Yukon was the third highest in spending on food in Canada. Nunavut was the highest at \$14,744 and Nova Scotia the lowest at \$7,235 per household. In Canada (excluding the territories), the average household expenditure on food was \$7,739.

Average Spending on Shelter, 2012

The average expenditure of Yukon households on shelter was \$16,443 in 2012, an increase of \$2,546 (18.3%) over 2009. Yukon was the fifth highest in spending on shelter. The Northwest Territories was the highest at \$21,697, followed by Alberta at \$19,309. New Brunswick households spent the least on shelter at \$11,077. The average expenditure on shelter in Canada (excluding the territories) was \$15,811.



Average Spending on Household Operation, 2012

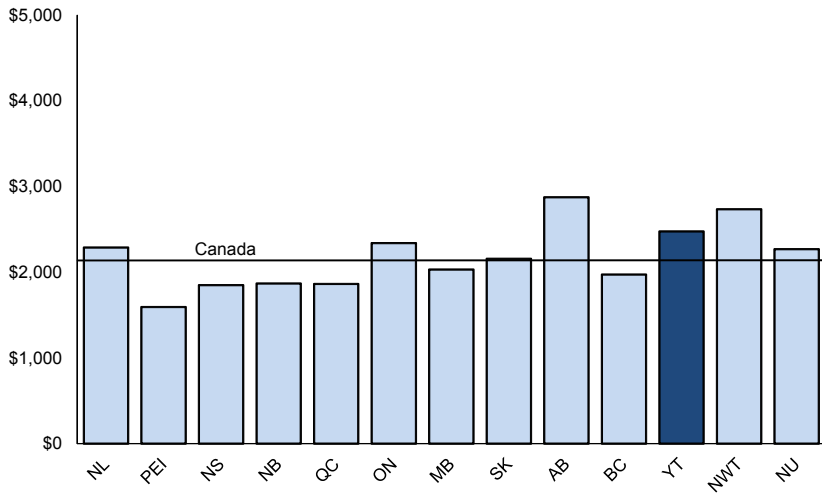


In 2012, Yukon households spent \$4,706 on average on household operation. This is an increase of \$875, or 22.8%, over 2009. Yukon was the fourth highest in spending on household operation. The Northwest Territories was the highest at \$5,777 and Quebec was the lowest at \$3,472. The average expenditure on household operation in Canada (excluding the territories) was \$4,111.

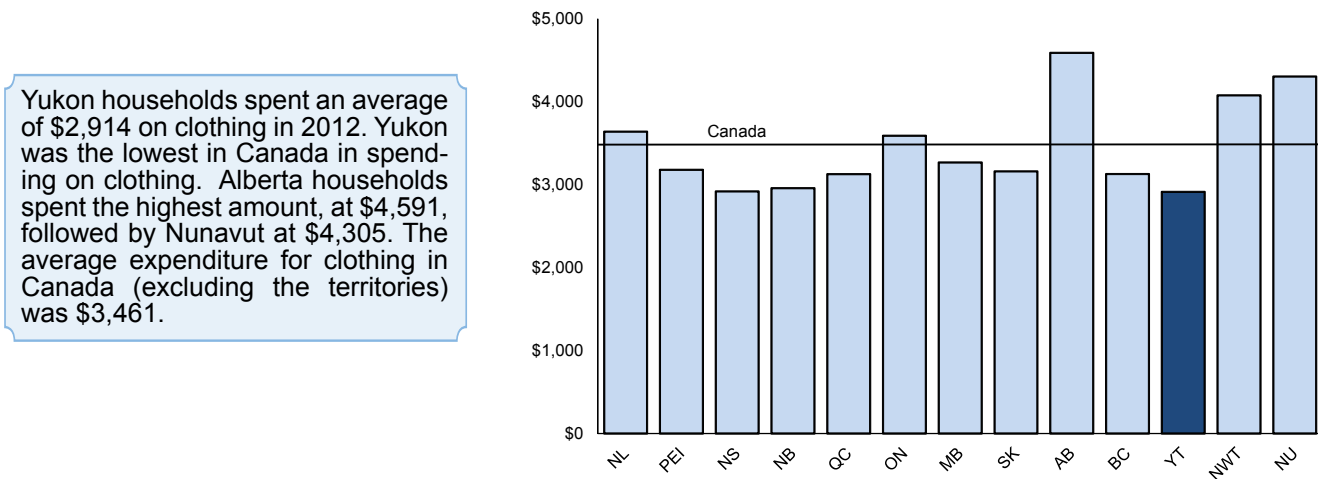
Household Spending, Canada, Provinces and Territories, 2012

Average Spending on Household Furnishings and Equipment, 2012



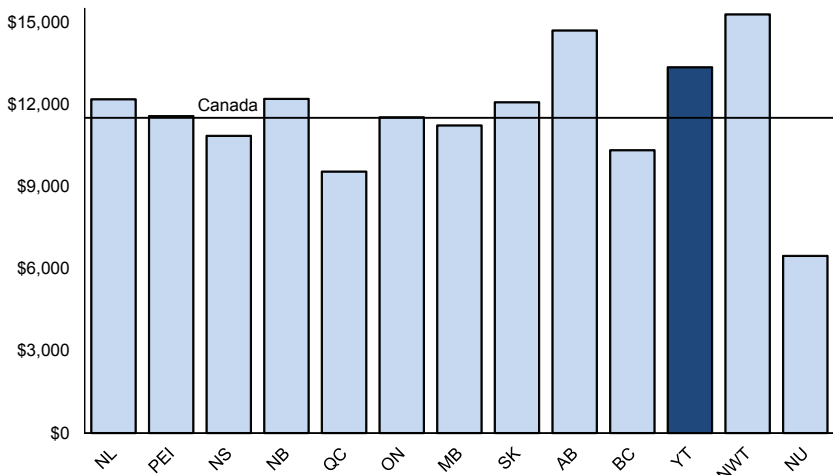
In 2012, the average expenditure of Yukon households on household furnishings and equipment was \$2,477. Yukon was the third highest in spending on household furnishings and equipment. Alberta was the highest at \$2,874, while Prince Edward Island was the lowest at \$1,594. The average expenditure on household furnishings and equipment in Canada (excluding the territories) was \$2,183.

Average Spending on Clothing, 2012



Yukon households spent an average of \$2,914 on clothing in 2012. Yukon was the lowest in Canada in spending on clothing. Alberta households spent the highest amount, at \$4,591, followed by Nunavut at \$4,305. The average expenditure for clothing in Canada (excluding the territories) was \$3,461.

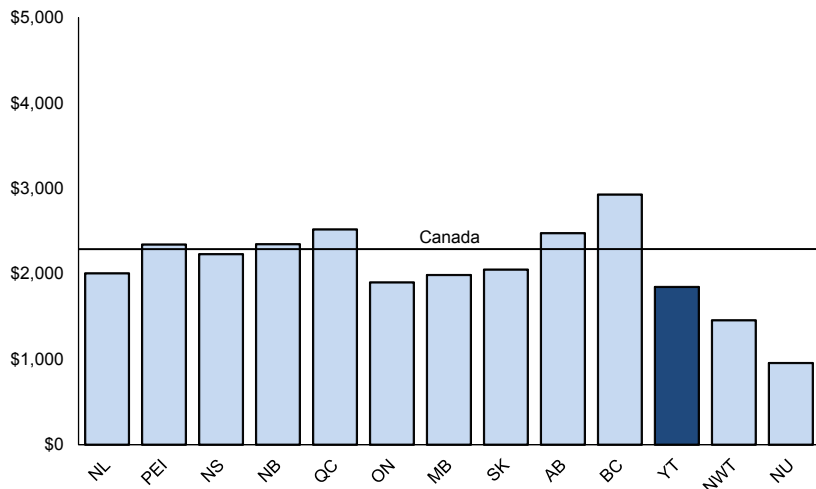
Average Spending on Transportation, 2012



The average expenditure of Yukon households on transportation in 2012 was \$13,344. Yukon was the third highest in spending on transportation, following the Northwest Territories (\$15,276), and Alberta (\$14,687). Households in Nunavut spent the least in Canada on transportation, at \$6,466. The average expenditure on transportation in Canada (excluding the territories) was \$11,216.

Household Spending, Canada, Provinces and Territories, 2012

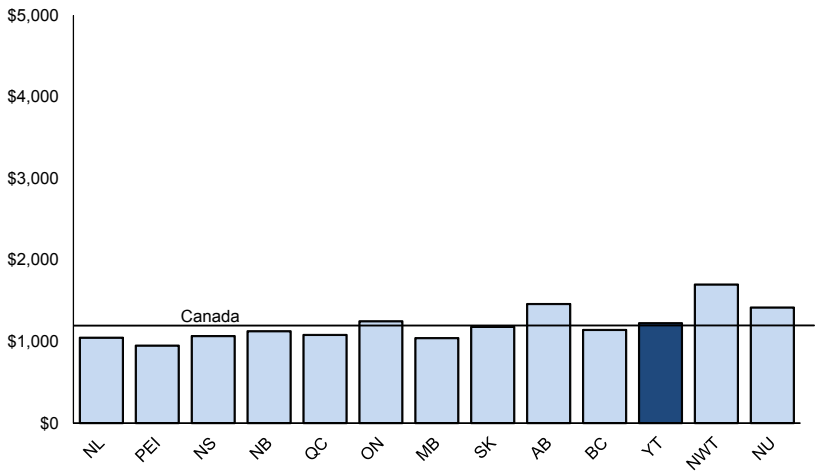
Average Spending on Health Care, 2012



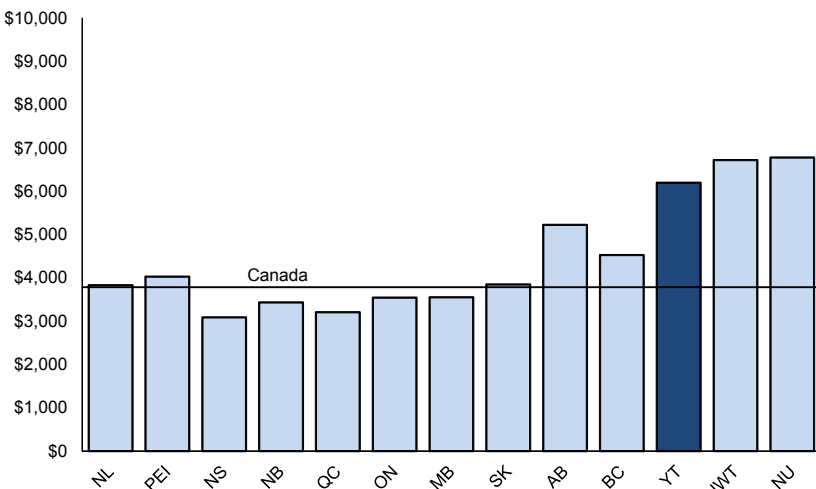
In 2012, the average expenditure on health care of Yukon households was \$1,846. Yukon was the third lowest in spending on health care, above the Northwest Territories (\$1,456) and Nunavut (\$956). British Columbia households spent the highest amount on health care, at \$2,929. The average expenditure on health care in Canada (excluding the territories) was \$2,285 in 2012.

Average Spending on Personal Care, 2012

Yukon households spent an average of \$1,225 on personal care in 2012, the fourth highest in Canada on personal care. Households in the Northwest Territories spent the most on personal care (\$1,699), while households in Prince Edward Island spent the least (\$950). The average expenditure on personal care in Canada (excluding the territories) was \$1,194.



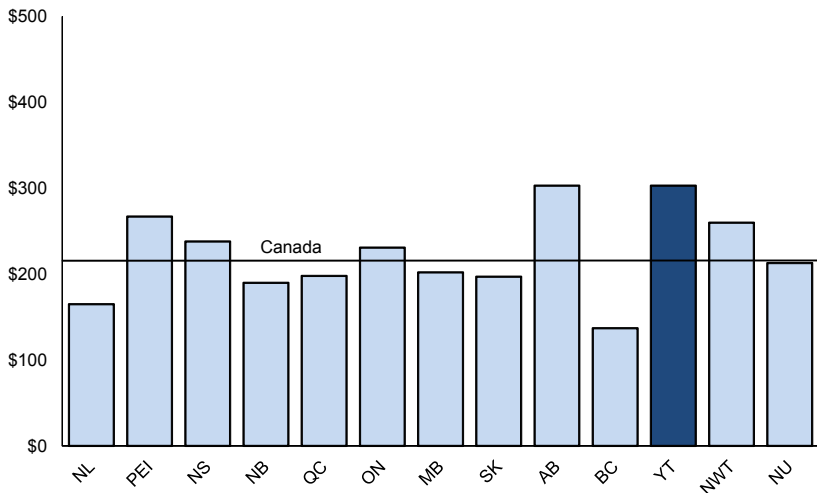
Average Spending on Recreation, 2012



The average expenditure on recreation of Yukon households was \$6,198 in 2012. Yukoners were the fifth highest in spending on recreation. Nunavut spent the most on recreation (\$6,778) and Nova Scotia spent the least (\$3,088). The average expenditure on recreation in Canada (excluding the territories) was \$3,773.

Average Spending on Reading Materials and Other Printed Matter, 2012

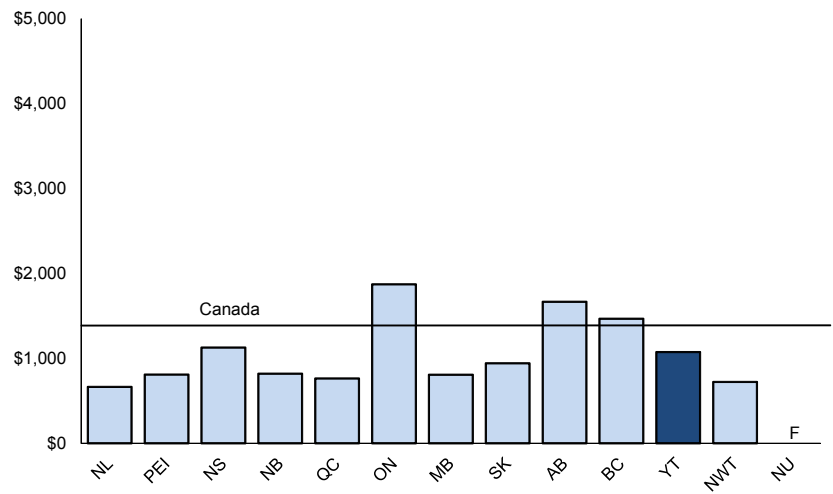


In 2012, the average expenditure of Yukon households on reading materials and other printed matter was \$303, tied with Alberta for the highest spending on this category. Prince Edward Island was the second highest at \$267, while British Columbia households spent the least, at \$137 in 2012. The average expenditure on reading materials and other printed matter in Canada (excluding the territories) was \$214.

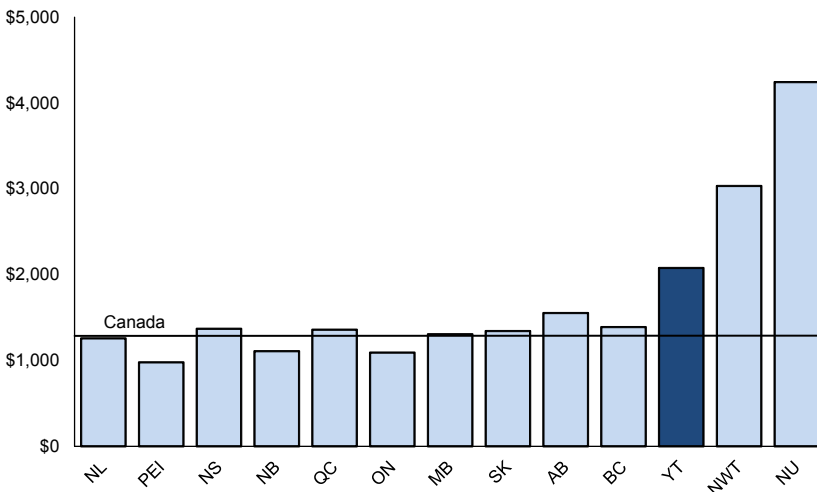
Average Spending on Education, 2012

The average expenditure of Yukon households on education was \$1,075 in 2012. Yukon was the sixth highest in Canada in spending on education. Households in Ontario spent the most on education, at \$1,872 and Newfoundland and Labrador spent the least at \$665. The average expenditure on education in Canada (excluding the territories) was \$1,386.

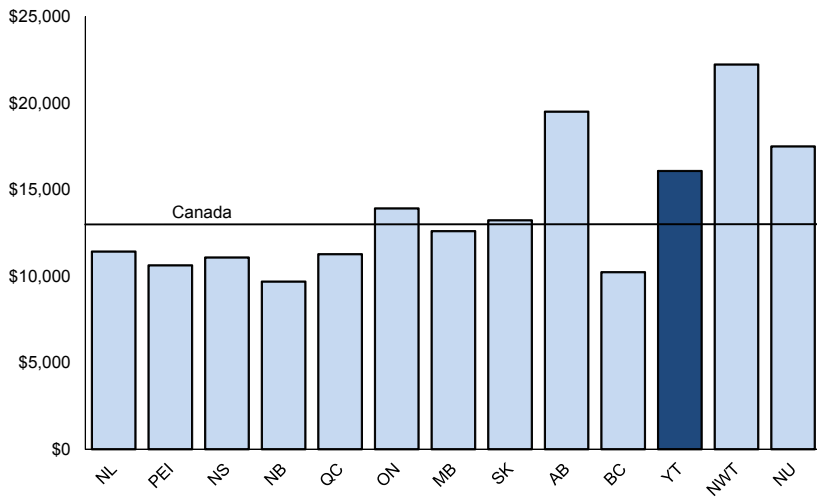
Average Spending on Tobacco Products and Alcoholic Beverages, 2012



In 2012, the average expenditure of Yukon households on tobacco products and alcoholic beverages was \$2,077. Yukon had the third highest spending on tobacco and alcohol, behind Nunavut (\$4,242) and the Northwest Territories (\$3,033). Prince Edward Island households spent the least on tobacco products and alcoholic beverages, at \$978. The average expenditure on tobacco products and alcoholic beverages in Canada (excluding the territories) was \$1,274.

Household Spending, Canada, Provinces and Territories, 2012

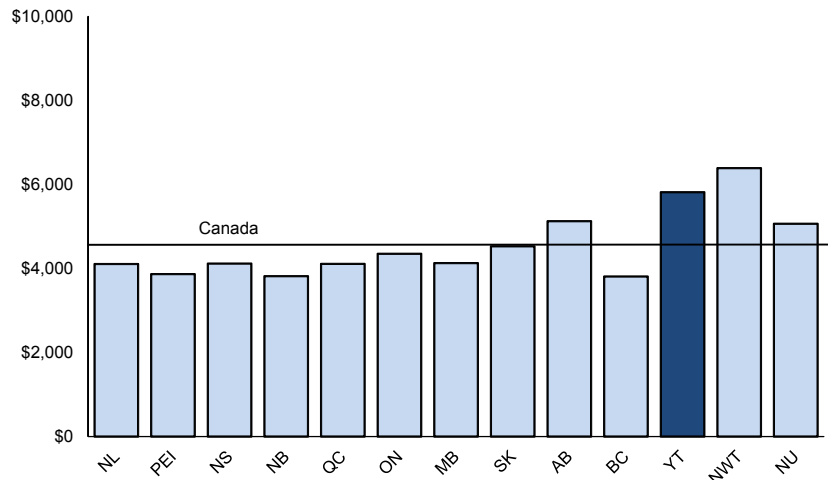
Average Spending on Personal Taxes (net of refunds), 2012



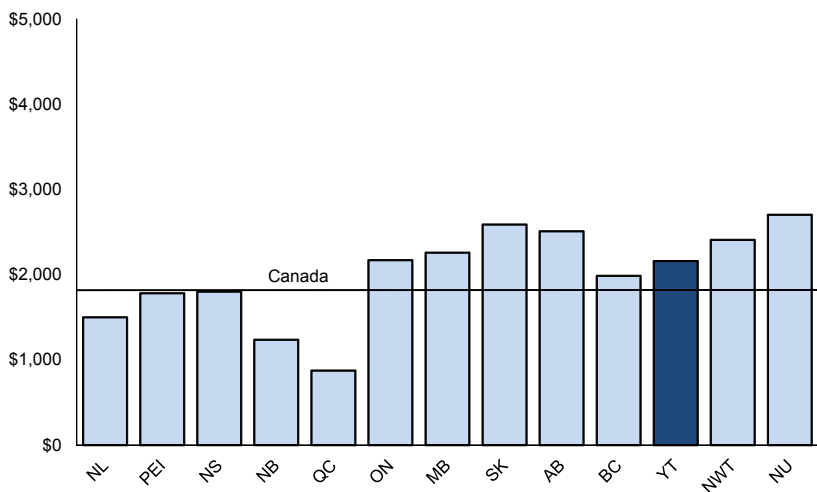
In 2012, the average expenditure on personal taxes of Yukon households was \$16,081. Yukon was the fourth highest among the provinces and territories in spending on personal taxes. The Northwest Territories was the highest, at \$22,228, while New Brunswick was the lowest at \$9,695. The average expenditure on personal taxes in Canada (excluding the territories) was \$13,060.

Average Spending Personal Insurance Payments and Pension Contributions, 2012

On average, Yukon households spent \$5,814 on personal insurance payments and pension contributions in 2012. Yukon was the second highest in spending in this category. The Northwest Territories spent the most on personal insurance payments and pension contributions (\$6,385), while British Columbia spent the least (\$3,809). The average expenditure on personal insurance payments and pension contributions in Canada (excluding the territories) was \$4,272.



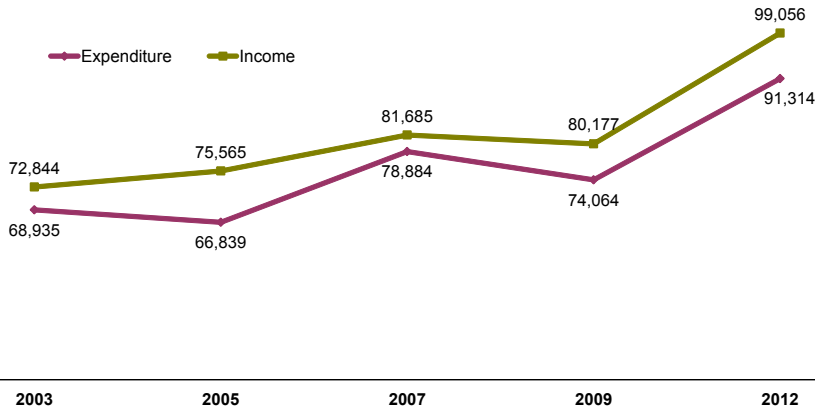
Average Spending on Gifts of Money and Contributions, 2012



In 2012, the average expenditure of Yukon households on gifts of money and contributions was \$2,160. Yukon was the seventh highest in spending on gifts of money and contributions; Nunavut was the highest (\$2,703) and Quebec was the lowest (\$875). The average expenditure on gifts of money and contributions in Canada (excluding the territories) was \$1,831.

In 2012, the average total household income in Whitehorse (\$99,056) was 23.5%, or \$18,879, higher than in the previous SHS in 2009. The average total expenditure (\$91,314) was 23.3%, or \$17,250, higher than in 2009.

In 2009, the average total household expenditure (\$74,064) was 92.4% of the average household income (\$80,177). In 2012, it was 92.2% of the average household income.

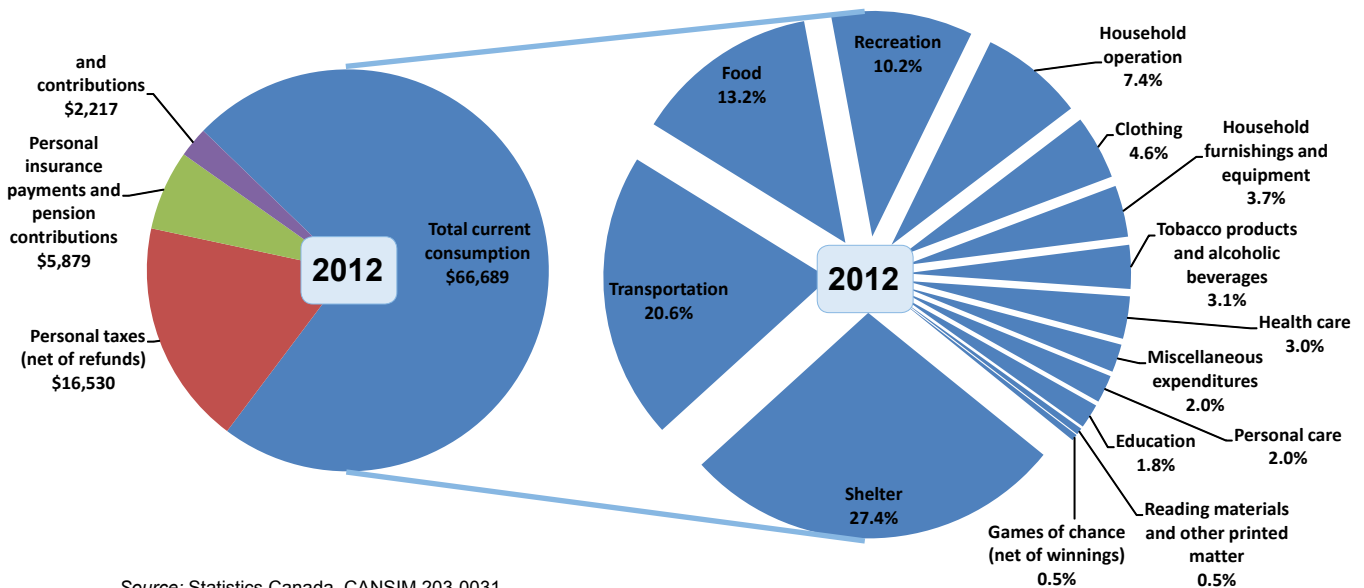
Did you know, in Whitehorse households, in 2012....

- 36.6% lived in dwellings with 7 or more rooms (Yukon 34.6%)
- 47.7% had 2 or more bathrooms with shower or bathtub (Yukon 40.0%)
- 48.8% had over 10 year-old principal heating equipment (Yukon 48.6%)
- 18.0% had 2 or more refrigerators (Yukon 17.2%).
- 22.9% had 3 or more telephones: including business use (Yukon 25.0%)
- 81.2% had a cellphone (Yukon 74.9%)
- 24.4% had a satellite dish (Yukon 33.6%)
- 27.1% had 3 or more color televisions (Yukon 25.5%).
- 60.8% owned 2 or more vehicles: auto, truck, van (Yukon 57.6%)

In 2012, the major share of current consumption of Whitehorse households was allocated to shelter costs (27.4%) followed by transportation (20.6%), food (13.2%) and recreation (10.2%).

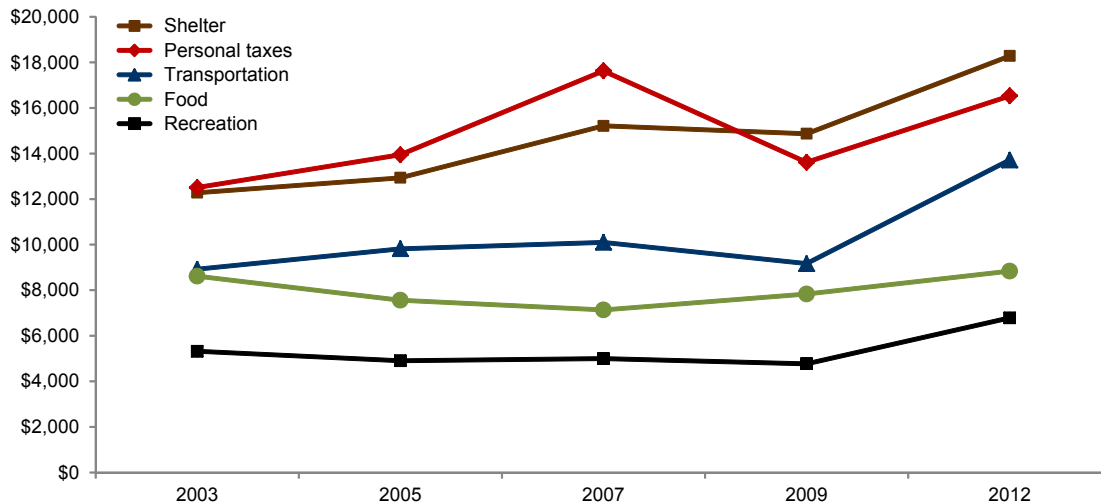

Average Household Spending, Top Five Expenditures, 2003 to 2012



Comparing 2012 to 2003, of the top five average household expenditure items:

- transportation expenditures increased by 53.7%, or \$4,794;
- shelter by 48.9% (\$6,004);
- personal taxes by 32.2% (\$4,027);
- recreation by 27.6% (\$1,466); while
- food expenditures increased only 2.6% or \$224.

Average Expenditure per Person: The average expenditure per person on an item is equal to the average expenditure per household for that item divided by the household size (line #1100). For example, to find the average expenditure per person on food (lines 10000 - 15600):

Average household expenditure on food Example: $\frac{\$7,496}{2.35} = \$3,189.79$ per person
Household size

Average Expenditure per Household: The average expenditure per household is equal to the estimated total expenditure of all households divided by the estimated number of households. The average is based on all households in a column, including households that reported a zero value.

Percentage Reporting: The percentage reporting is the percentage of households that reported purchasing an item. These percentages cannot be added together to form sub-totals.

Average Expenditure per Household Reporting: Average expenditure per household reporting is calculated for those households that reported the expenditure, i.e. without zero values. Average expenditure per household reporting was calculated using unrounded data. Note also that expenditures in this column do not add to sub-totals. To calculate the average expenditure per household reporting the purchase of an item, divide the average household expenditure on that item by the corresponding percentage reporting, and then multiply by 100. For example, to find the average expenditure on pets by households that actually had pet expenses:

Average household expenditure on pet expenses x 100 Example: $\frac{\$607}{61.5} \times 100 = \997.00
Percentage reporting

Percentage of Total Expenditure: The percentage of total expenditure is calculated by expressing the average expenditure per household as a percentage of total expenditure. This statistic is also known as "budget share."

Notes:

In 2010, for all provinces, a new SHS methodology was introduced which combined a questionnaire and a diary to collect the household expenditure data. In addition, reference periods were reduced and collection became continuous throughout the year. Data related to household income and income tax were mainly derived from an administrative data source. As a result of the changes made to data collection, processing and estimation methods, historical comparisons provided in this report should be used with caution.

Contrary to the changes in provincial methodology, the questionnaire and methodology for data collection in the territories remained unchanged in 2012 (questionnaire with 12-month recall period only, no diary of expenditures). Therefore, estimates for Canada do not include territorial estimates.

Please note, that the 2012 SHS territorial estimates are based on weights adjusted to demographic estimates produced using the 2006 Census. In terms of comparability with previous years, caution should be exercised as previous years' territorial weights were adjusted to demographic estimates produced using 2001 Census data.
