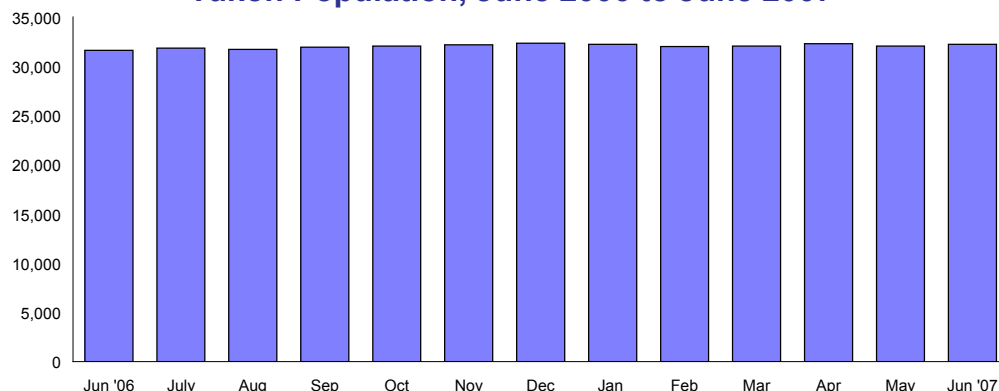


1 Monthly Yukon Population Estimates for 2006 & 2007

- Between June 2006 and June 2007, the monthly population of the Yukon increased from 31,608 to 32,212, a variation of 604 people.
- The average population of the Yukon over the last twelve months (July 2006 to June 2007) was 32,066. This is an increase of 564 persons, or 1.8%, from the 2005/06 average of 31,502 for the same time period.
- Looking at the last twelve months, the Yukon's population increased somewhat steadily in the last six months of 2006 followed by slight fluctuations in the first six months of 2007.

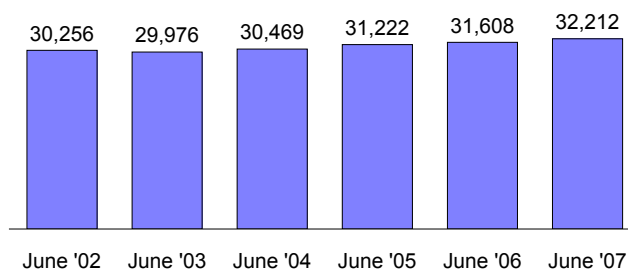

The Yukon's Population In June, 2002 to 2007



As of June 2007, the population of the Yukon was 32,212. This is the highest population for any June since 1997. This is also the fourth consecutive June population increase after six consecutive decreases in the June population after the Faro mine closure in 1997.

- In June 2007, the Yukon's population consisted of 16,197 males (50.3%) and 16,015 females (49.7%).
- There were 5,678 people (17.6%) under 15 years of age, 24,108 (74.8%) between 15 and 64 years of age, and 2,426 people (7.5%) who were 65 years of age or older.

Highlights of Population Changes in Yukon's Four Largest Communities

Between June 2006 and June 2007, the Whitehorse population increased by 1.7%. During the same time period, the Dawson City population increased by 5.3%, the Watson Lake population increased by 3.4%, and the Haines Junction population decreased by 0.1%.

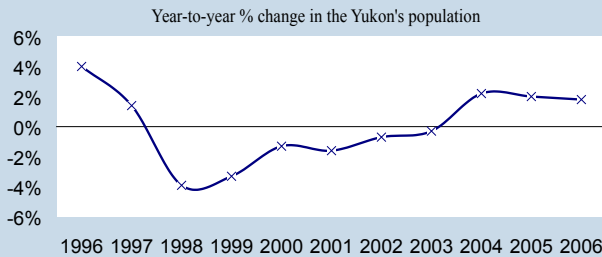

Historical Population Estimates

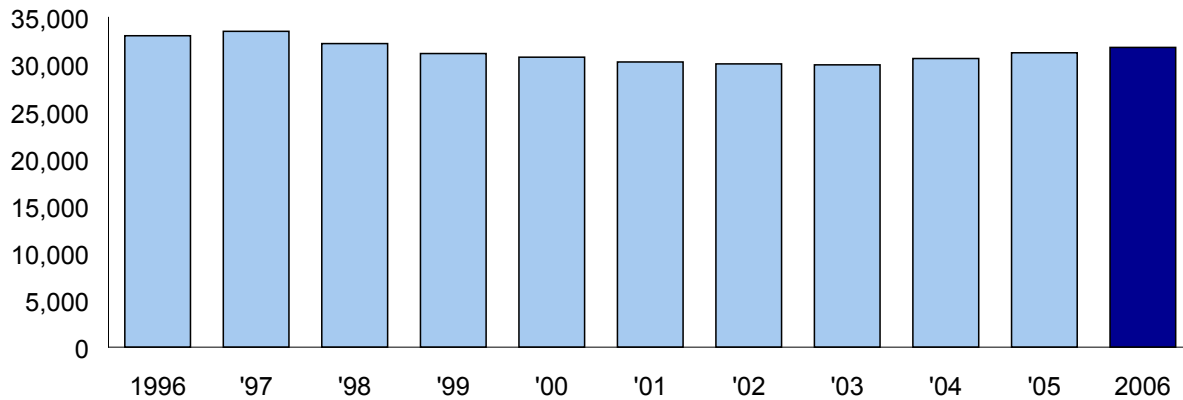
Comparing 1996 to 2006, the annual average population of the Yukon decreased by 1248 people (from 33,051 to 31,803). This represents an annual average growth rate of -0.4%. However, this growth has not occurred evenly from year to year. Rather, it has ranged from a high of 4.0% between '95 and '96 to a low of -3.9% between '97 and '98.

Population estimates are used by the public sector, private sector and the general public. The Yukon Bureau of Statistics produces population estimates twice a year. Figures for the months of January to June are released in July of the same year while population estimates for the months of July to December are released in January of the next year.

These population estimates are statistically based on the Yukon Health Care Registration file. The figures are sorted by postal codes and community codes. Users of this information should be aware that the community population includes not only the legally defined city limits, but also the population that lives in the immediately surrounding area.
