## Balance of Trade 1999–2004

Balance-of-trade figures are produced by Statistics Canada and reflect the balance of trade between Yukon and the rest of Canada as well as total Yukon international trade. In this publication, Yukon production and consumption of both goods and services is shown for each year from 1999 to 2004.

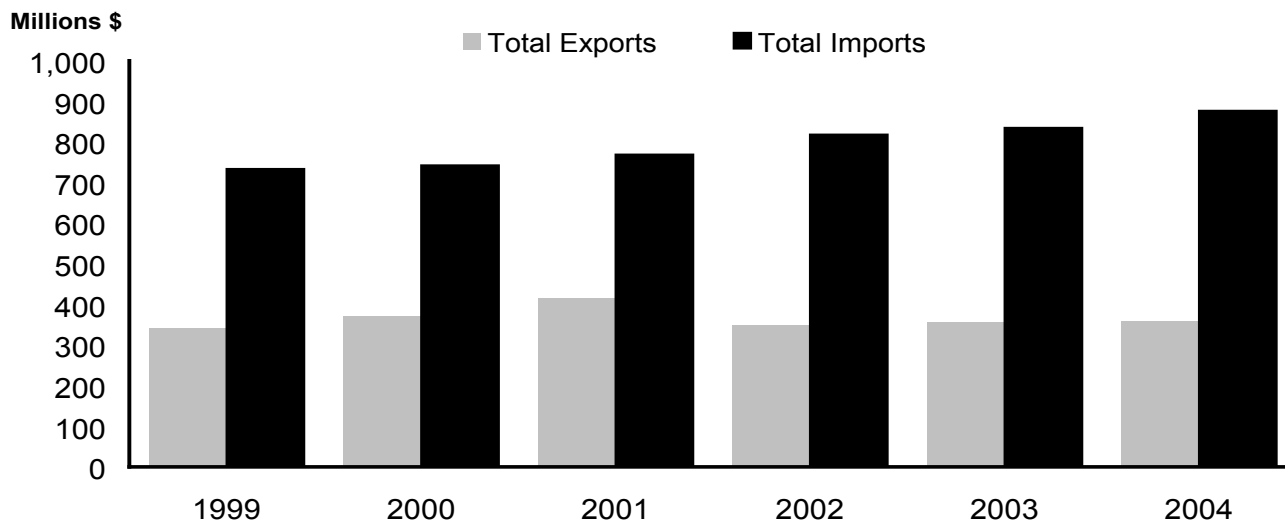

As indicated in the adjacent table, the vast majority of Yukon produced goods and services were consumed within the Yukon. The level of exports rose gradually from 1999 to 2001, peaking at \$416.2 million before falling again. In 2004 total exports were at \$359.5 million. Between 1999 and 2003, exports on average accounted for 17.0% of all goods and services produced. In 2004 exports accounted for 14.9% of all Yukon goods and services produced. In dollar value, between 1999 and 2003, inter-provincial exports averaged \$195.8 million. Inter-provincial exports in 2004 were well below this average at \$182.1 million, while international exports were \$177.4 million. This is slightly above the 1999 to 2003 average for international exports of \$173.0 million.

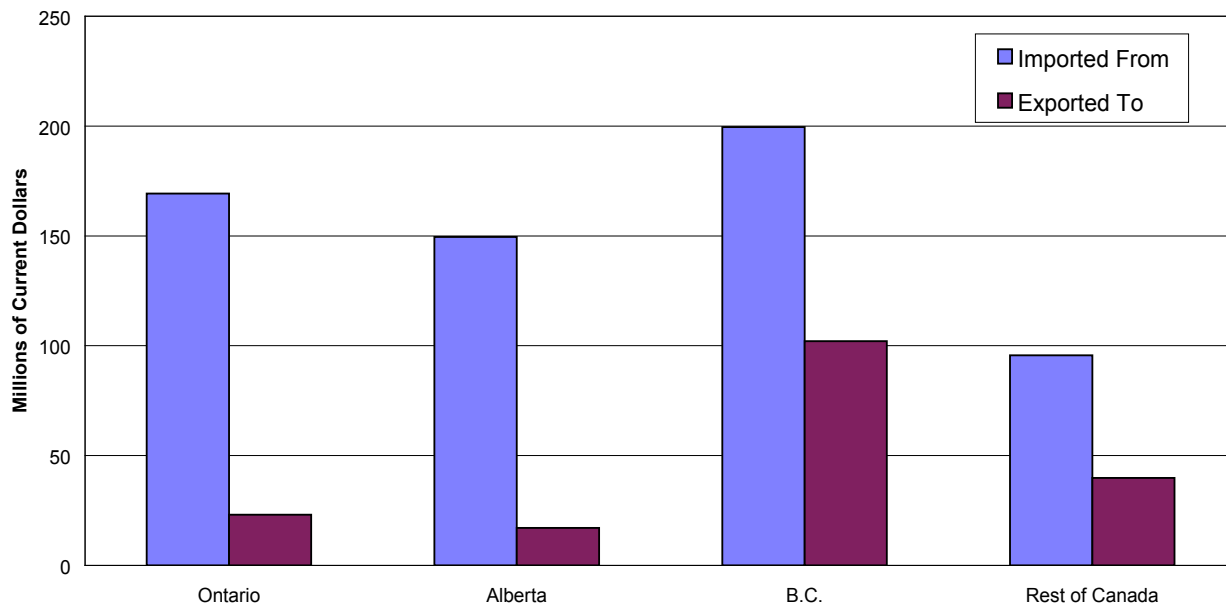

The majority of goods and services consumed in the Yukon were produced in the Yukon. Imports of goods and services as a percentage of total Yukon consumption of goods and services have remained at fairly consistent levels over the years 1999 to 2003, averaging 30.3%. In 2004, imports accounted for 29.9% of goods and services consumed. Inter-provincial imports made up over two-thirds of the total imports to the Yukon, 70.0%, in 2004. International imports made up the remainder, 30.0%, in 2004.
