Balance of Trade 2007

Balance-of-trade figures are produced by Statistics Canada and reflect the balance of trade between Yukon and the rest of Canada, as well as total Yukon international trade. In this publication, Yukon's production and consumption of both goods and services is shown for each year from 2002 to 2007.

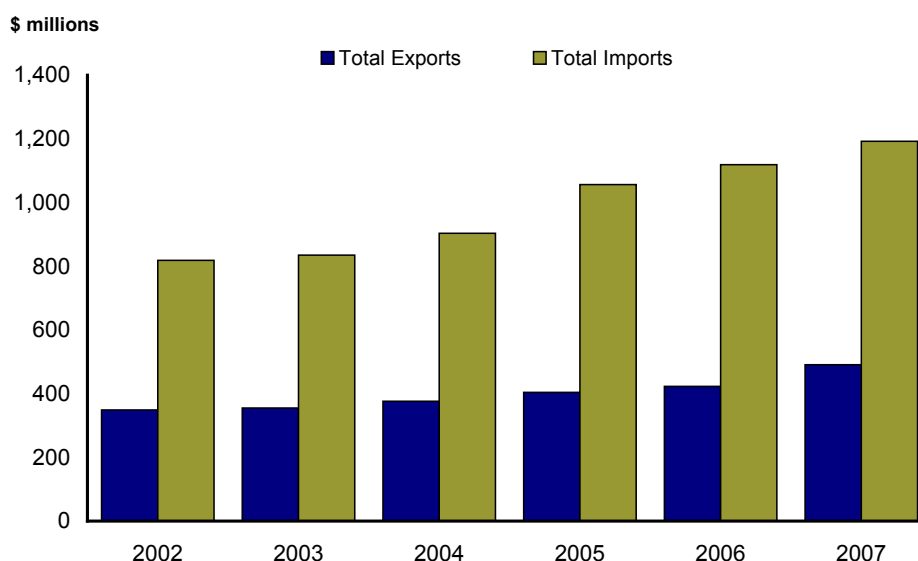

Between 2002 and 2007, the vast majority of Yukon-produced goods and services were consumed within Yukon. Since 2002, the value of goods and services exported has increased each year, from \$348.7 million in 2002, to \$491.0 million in 2007. Between 2002 and 2006, exports on average accounted for 15.2% of all goods and services produced. In 2007 this trend continued when exports accounted for 15.1% of all Yukon goods and services produced.

Between 2002 and 2004, inter-provincial exports remained relatively steady at about \$190 million. Since 2004, inter-provincial exports have increased dramatically each year to over \$300 million in 2007.

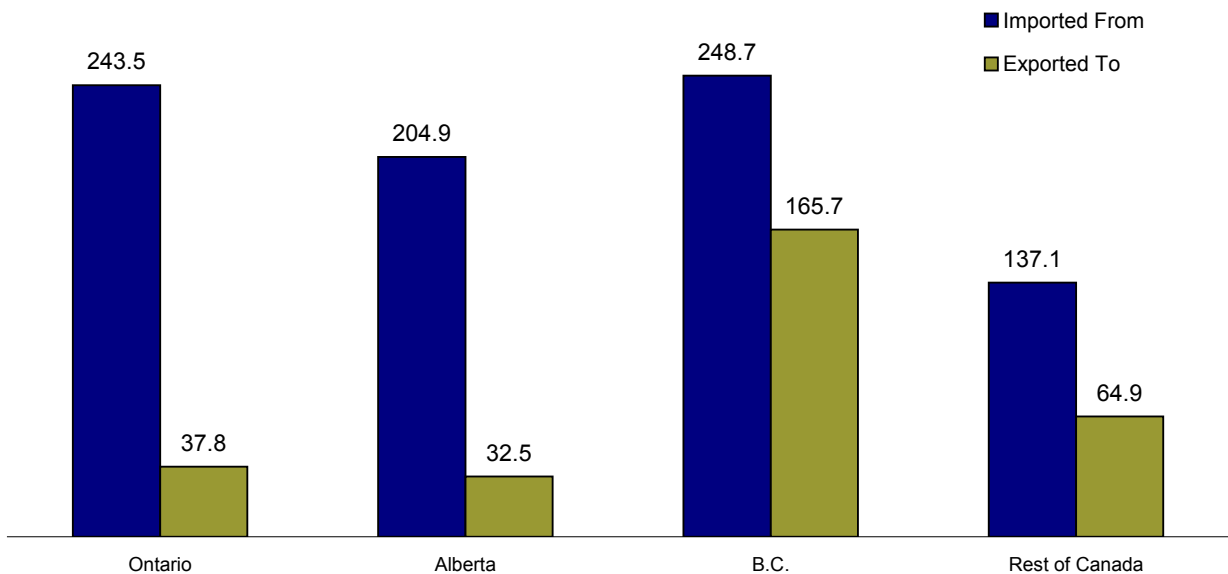

Imports of goods and services as a percentage of total Yukon consumption of have remained at fairly consistent levels over the years 2002 to 2006, averaging 30.6%. In 2007, imports accounted for 30.2% of goods and services consumed.

Inter-provincial imports made up 70% of the total imports to Yukon in 2007, while international imports made up the remaining 30%.
