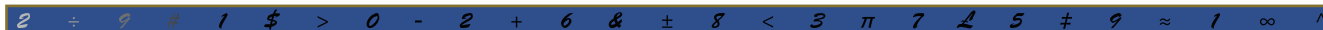

Balance of Trade 2009

Balance of trade figures are produced by Statistics Canada and reflect the balance of trade between Yukon and the rest of Canada, as well as Yukon's total international trade. In this publication, Yukon's imports and exports of both goods and services is provided from data in CANSIM 386-0003 for 2009 only; previously published data are not comparable. Please see note to readers.

Note to readers:

The data from the 2009 Input-Output tables reflect new classifications, and conceptual and statistical improvements as part of a comprehensive revision to the System of National Economic Accounts. In 2009, \$3,047.5 million worth of goods and services were produced and consumed in Yukon. An additional \$729.7 million were exported to other provinces/territories or out of country.

Of the \$729.7 million dollars in exports of goods and services, \$397.3 million were interprovincial (54.4%) and \$332.2 million international (45.5%).

Out of the \$397.3 million dollars in interprovincial exports, \$383.9 million were services and \$13.4 million were goods. Major Canadian export partners were: British Columbia (receiving 48.1% of all Yukon exports); Ontario (16.3%); Northwest Territories (13.2%) and Alberta (9.7%).

Of the \$332.2 million dollars in international exports, \$242.1 million were goods and \$90.1 million were services.

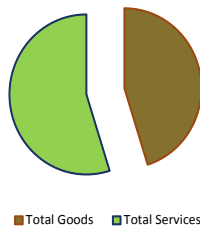
In 2009, Yukon required an additional \$1,351.9 million in imports. These imports were comprised of \$610.0 million in goods and \$742.0 million in services.

Of the \$1,351.9 million in total imports, \$1,000.6 million were interprovincial imports (33.2% goods; 66.8% services) and \$351.3 million were international (79.2% goods; 20.8% services).

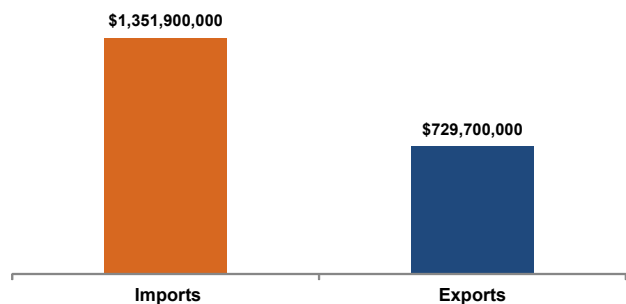

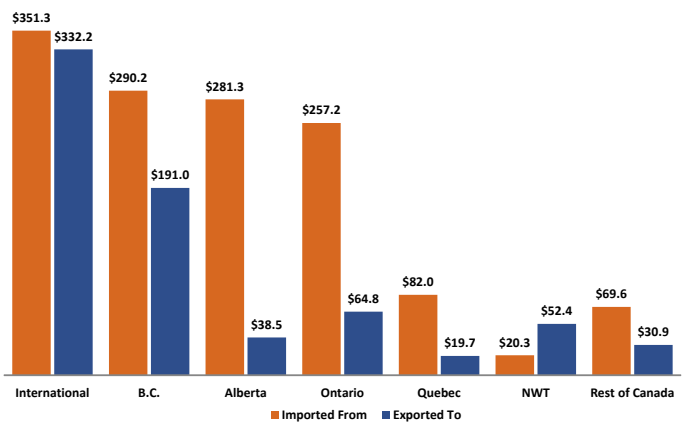
TOTAL IMPORTS
