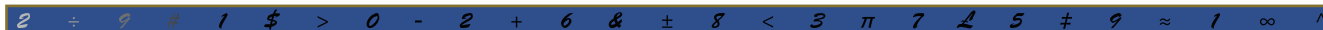

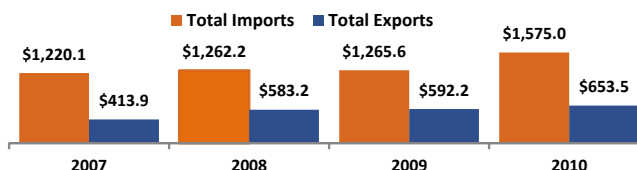


## Balance of Trade 2010

### Highlights:

- In 2010, Yukon's total production of goods and services was \$4,164.3 million: \$3,510.6 million (84.3%) of production was directly consumed in Yukon, while \$653.5 million (15.7%) was exported.
- An additional \$1,575.0 million in imports of goods and services was needed to meet total Yukon consumption needs of \$5,085.5 million.

Yukon's exports grew by \$61.3 million, or 10.4%, from \$592.2 million in 2009 to \$653.5 million in 2010. During the same period, imports increased by \$309.4 million, or 24.4%.

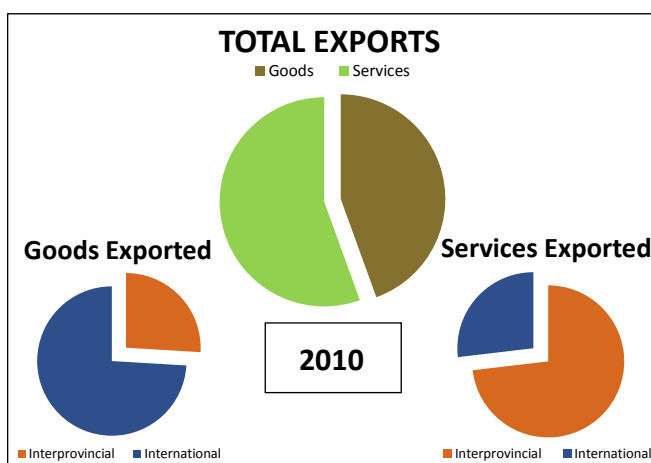
- In 2010, \$4,164.3 million worth of goods and services were produced in Yukon, an increase of \$524.7 million (14.4%) compared to revised figures from 2009.
- Of the 2010 production figure, \$3,510.6 million was consumed directly in Yukon and \$653.5 million was exported.

Balance of trade figures are produced by Statistics Canada and reflect the balance of trade between Yukon and the rest of Canada, as well as total Yukon international trade [CANSIM 386-0003]. Please see note to readers on back of page.



- Of the \$653.5 million dollars in exports of Yukon-produced goods and services in 2010, \$340.8 million were interprovincial (52.1%) and \$312.7 million were international (47.9%).

- Compared to 2009, total exports in 2010 increased 10.4%; interprovincial exports 6.0%; and international exports 15.5%.

- Of the \$312.7 million dollars in 2010 international exports, \$215.2 million were goods (68.8%) and \$97.5 million (31.2%) were services.

- Of the \$340.8 million dollars in 2010 interprovincial exports, \$75.4 million (22.1%) were goods and \$265.4 million were services (77.9%).

- Major Canadian export partners in 2010 were: Ontario (receiving 39.0% of all Yukon exports); British Columbia (27.1%) and Alberta (11.2%).

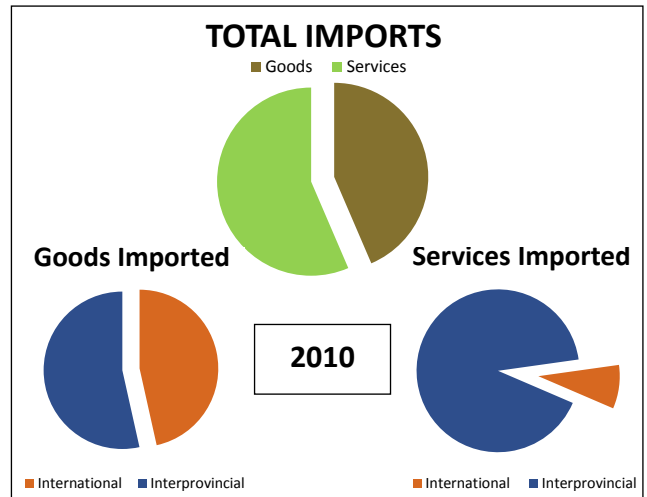

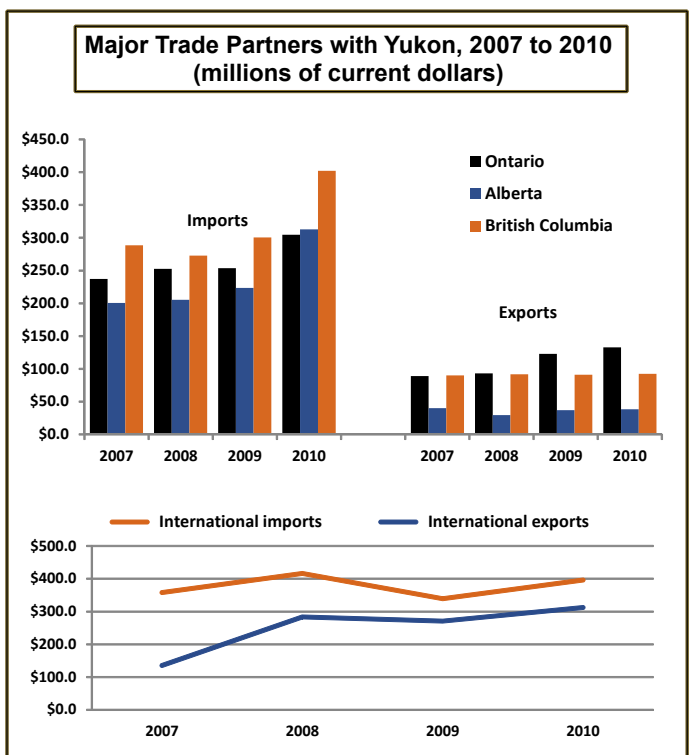

- In 2010, Yukon required an additional \$1,575.0 million in imports. These imports were comprised of \$685.7 million in goods and \$889.3 million in services.
- Of the \$1,575.0 million in total imports in 2010, \$1,178.9 million were interprovincial imports (31.1% goods; 68.9% services) and \$396.1 million were international (80.5% goods; 19.5% services).
