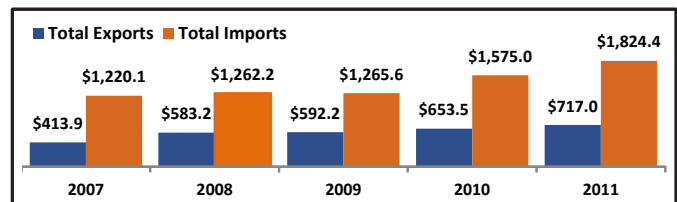

## Balance of Trade 2011

### Highlights:

- In 2011, Yukon's total production of goods and services was \$4,467.1 million: \$3,749.9 million (83.9%) of production was directly consumed in Yukon, while \$717.0 million (16.1%) was exported.
- An additional \$1,824.4 million in imports of goods and services was needed to meet total Yukon consumption needs of \$5,574.2 million in 2011.
- Yukon's exports in 2011 grew by \$63.5 million, or 9.7%, to \$717.0 million from \$653.5 million in 2010. During the same period, imports increased by \$249.4 million, or 15.8%, from \$1,575.0 million in 2010 to \$1,824.4 million in 2011.

Balance of trade figures are produced by Statistics Canada and reflect the balance of trade between Yukon and the rest of Canada, as well as total Yukon international trade [CANSIM 386-0003].

• Of the \$717.0 million dollars in exports of Yukon-produced goods and services in 2011, \$436.9 million were interprovincial (60.9%) and \$280.1 million were international (39.1%).

• Compared to 2010, total exports in 2011 increased by \$63.5 million (9.7%); interprovincial exports increased by \$96.1 million (28.2%); and international exports decreased by \$32.6 million (-10.4%).

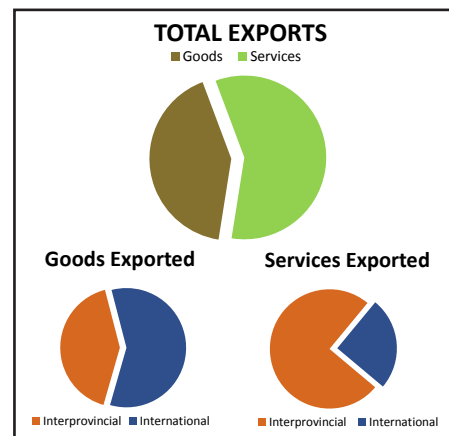
• Of the \$436.9 million dollars in 2011 interprovincial exports, \$124.4 million were goods (28.5%) and \$312.5 million were services (71.5%).

• Major Canadian export partners in 2011 were: Ontario (receiving 35.5% of all Yukon exports); British Columbia (33.1%) and Alberta (11.1%).

• Of the \$280.1 million in 2011 international exports<sup>2</sup>, \$175.2 million were goods (62.6%) and \$104.8 million were services (37.4%).

• In 2011, \$4,467.1 million in goods and services were produced in Yukon, an increase of \$302.8 million (7.3%) compared to 2010.

• Of the 2011 production figure (\$4,467.1 million), \$3,749.9 million (83.9%) was consumed directly in Yukon and \$717.0 million (16.1%) was exported.

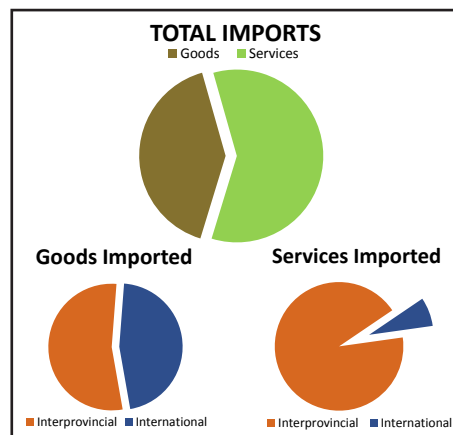

- In 2011, Yukon consumed \$3,749.9 million, or 83.9%, of the total (\$4,467.1 million) goods and services produced in Yukon. An additional \$1,824.4 million in imports was required to meet Yukon's total consumption needs. These imports were comprised of \$745.9 million in goods (up 8.8% compared to 2010) and \$1,078.5 million in services (up 21.3%).

- Of the \$1,824.4 million in total imports in 2011, \$1,402.9 million (76.9%) were interprovincial imports and \$421.5 million (23.1%) were international.



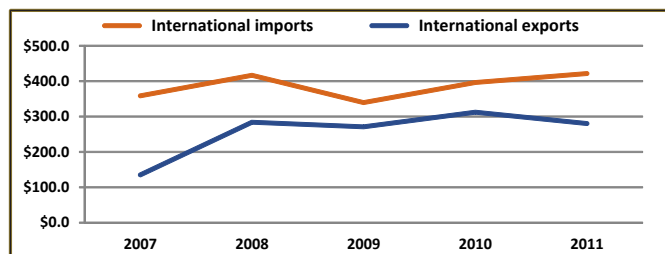
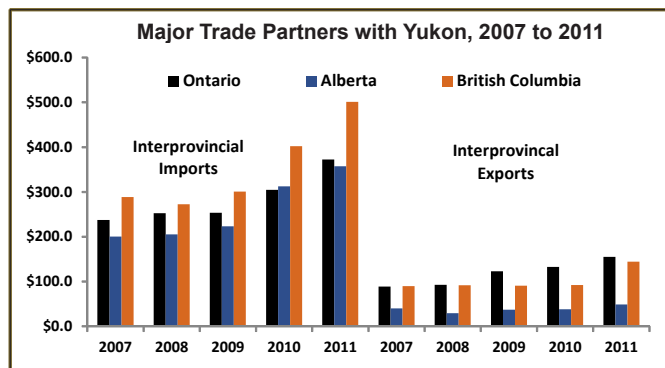

- Compared to 2010, total imports in 2011 increased by \$249.4 million (15.8%); interprovincial imports increased by \$224.0 million (19.0%); and international imports increased by \$25.4 million (6.4%).

- Of the \$1,402.9 million in interprovincial imports to Yukon, \$402.7 million were goods (28.7%) and \$1,000.2 million were services (71.3%).

- Of the \$421.5 million in international imports to Yukon in 2011, \$343.2 million were goods (81.4%) and \$78.3 million were services (18.6%).



## Did you know?

Over the last five years, Yukon consumed an average of 85% of the goods and services that it produced. However, local production only accounted for 70% of its total consumption needs.
