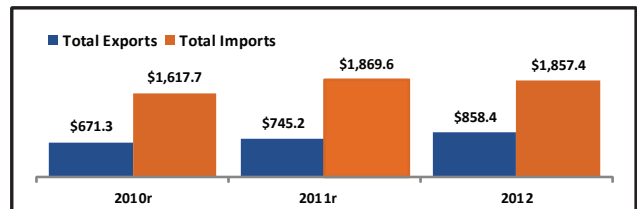

## Balance of Trade 2012

### Highlights:

- In 2012, Yukon's total production of goods and services was \$4,521.9 million: \$3,634.4 million (80.4%) of production was consumed in Yukon; \$858.4 million (19.0%) was exported; and \$29.1 million (0.6%) was added to the inventory.
- An additional \$1,857.4 million in imports of goods and services was needed to meet Yukon's total consumption needs of \$5,491.8 million in 2012.
- Yukon's exports in 2012 grew by \$113.2 million, or 15.2%, to \$858.4 million from \$745.2 million in 2011. During the same period, imports decreased by \$12.2 million, or 0.7%, from \$1,869.6 million in 2011 to \$1,857.4 million in 2012.

Current data on imports/exports at the territorial level are not available. The import/export data in this publication is taken from the Supply and Use Tables (SUTS) of Statistics Canada (CANSIM 381-0035). The data in SUTS are available for 2010 to 2012 and are subject to revision.

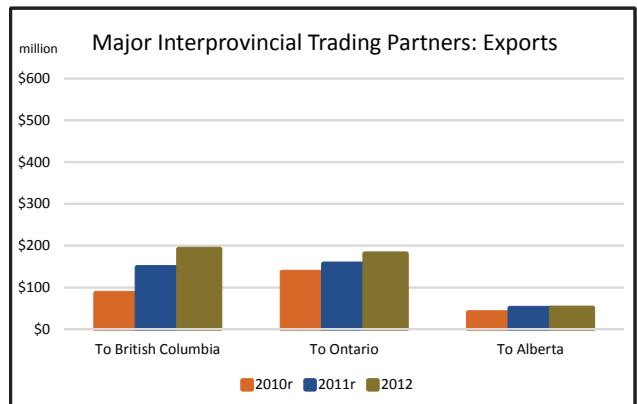

- In 2012, \$4,521.9 million in goods and services were produced in Yukon, an increase of \$113.1 million (2.6%) compared to 2011.
- Of the 2012 production figure (\$4,521.9 million), \$3,634.4 million (80.4%) was consumed in Yukon, \$858.4 million (19.0%) was exported and the inventory increased by \$29.1 million (0.6%).
- Comparing 2012 to 2011, total exports (\$858.4 million) increased by \$113.2 million, or 15.2%. This increase was comprised of \$86.4 million in interprovincial exports and \$26.8 million in international exports.



- Major interprovincial export destinations in 2012 were: British Columbia (36.2% of all Yukon exports); Ontario (34.1%); and Alberta (9.6% of all Yukon exports).
- Exports to all other provinces and territories increased in 2012 with the exceptions of Newfoundland and Labrador, and Prince Edward Island.
- From 2011 to 2012, the largest increase in the value of interprovincial exports was to British Columbia: up by \$44.1 million, or 29.9%.
- Of the total interprovincial exports (\$530.0 million) in 2012, *Retail margins, sales of used goods and commissions* accounted for 14.2%, *Transportation and related services*, 12.2%, and *Accommodation and food services* accounted for 7.4%.
- Of the total international exports (\$328.4 million) in 2012, *Accommodation and food services* accounted for 10.2%, *Transportation and related services*, 8.3%, and *Professional services (except software and research and development)* accounted for 6.6%.

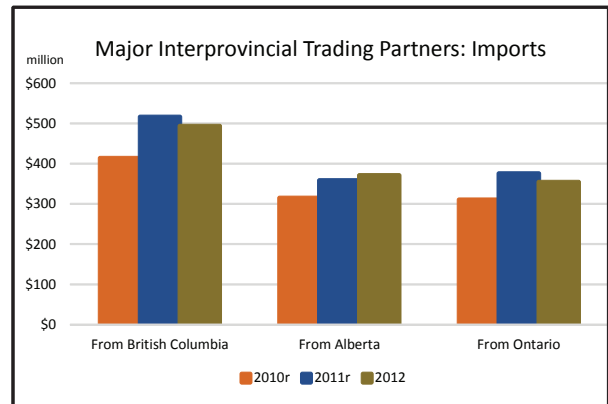

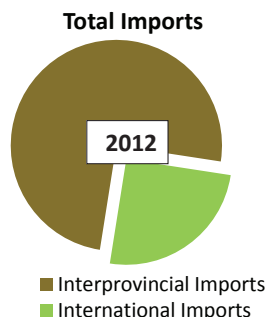

- In 2012, Yukon consumed \$3,634.4 million, or 80.4%, of the total (\$4,521.9 million) goods and services produced in Yukon. An additional \$1,857.4 million in imports was required to meet Yukon's total consumption needs of \$5,491.8 million.
- Of the \$1,857.4 million in total imports in 2012, \$1,391.6 million (74.9%) were interprovincial imports and \$465.8 million (25.1%) were international.
- Comparing 2012 to 2011, total imports (\$1,857.4 million) decreased by \$12.2 million, or 0.7%. This decrease was comprised a \$28.4 million reduction in interprovincial imports and a \$16.2 million increase in international imports.
- Major import partners to Yukon in 2012 were: British Columbia (35.5% of all imports to Yukon); Alberta (26.7%); and Ontario (25.5% of all imports to Yukon).
- Imports from most provinces and territories increased in 2012 with the exceptions of British Columbia, Ontario, Quebec, Northwest Territories and Newfoundland and Labrador.
- The largest increase in the value of interprovincial imports in 2012 was from Alberta: up by \$12.5 million, or 3.5%.



In 2012, interprovincial exports accounted for 61.7% of total exports, while international exports (including re-exports) accounted for 38.3%.

Interprovincial imports accounted for 74.9% of total imports in 2012, while international imports made up the remaining 25.1%
