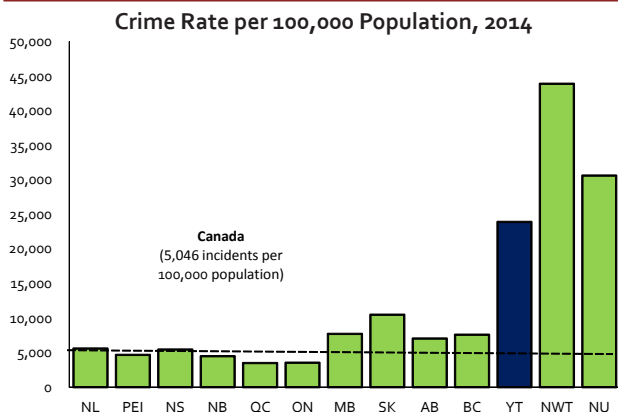
Police-reported Crime Statistics in Yukon 2014

This report is based on data released by Statistics Canada from the incident-based Uniform Crime Reporting Survey (UCR). The UCR collects information on all criminal incidents (of adults and youth) reported to, and substantiated by, Canadian police services.

Highlights:

- A total of 9,720 criminal incidents were reported to police in Yukon in 2014: 1,660 violent Criminal Code violations; 3,415 property crime; 3,658 'other' Criminal Code violations; 617 Criminal Code traffic violations; and 370 Federal Statutes violations.
- Yukon's 2014 police-reported crime rate (23,919 incidents per 100,000 population) was 0.3% higher than the 2013 rate (23,842 incidents per 100,000).

Crime Rate, Canada, Provinces and Territories, 2014



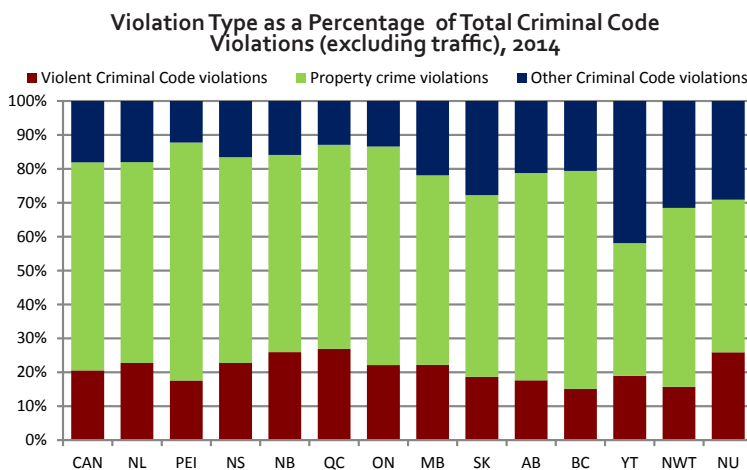
- Yukon's 2014 crime rate was the third highest in the country at 23,919 incidents per 100,000 population.
- In 2014, the crime rate increased 0.3% compared to 2013 (23,842 incidents per 100,000). However, the 2014 crime rate was 7.8% higher than the 2005 rate (22,188 incidents per 100,000).

Criminal Code traffic offences, as well as federal statute violations are not included in the calculation of the crime rate.

Crime counts are based on the most serious offence in an incident; however, violent criminal incidents are generally counted separately for each victim.

Criminal Code Violations (excluding traffic), Canada, Provinces and Territories, 2014

- In 2014, there were 8,733 actual incidents of Criminal Code violations (excluding traffic) in Yukon. Of this total, 19.0% were violent Criminal Code violations; 39.1% were property crimes; and 41.9% were 'other' Criminal Code violations*. In terms of the proportion of total incidents:
 - Yukon ranked the sixth lowest in the country for violent Criminal Code violations,
 - the lowest in the country for property crimes, and
 - the highest in Canada for 'other' Criminal Code violations.
- The above Yukon proportions compare nationally at: 20.6% violent Criminal Code violations; 61.4% property crime; and 18.1% 'other' Criminal Code violations.



* While 'other' Criminal Code violations typically include counterfeiting, weapons violations, child pornography, prostitution, disturb the peace and administration of justice, etc., these 'other' violations for Yukon (3,658 incidents) mainly included disturb the peace (2,634 incidents) and administration of justice (840 incidents).

[†]Sexual violations against children is a new crime category with only partial data available prior to 2008. As a result, numbers and rates should not be directly compared to data from previous years.

Crimes against the person involve the use or threatened use of violence against a person, including homicide, attempted murder, assault, sexual assault and robbery. Robbery is considered a crime against the person because unlike other theft offences it involves the use or threat of violence.

[†]In April 2011, legislation came into effect making it an offence to traffic in property obtained by crime, including possession with intent to traffic property obtained by crime.

[‡]In January 2010, the UCR survey was modified to create new violation codes for identity fraud and identity theft. Prior to 2010, those offences would have been coded as fraud.

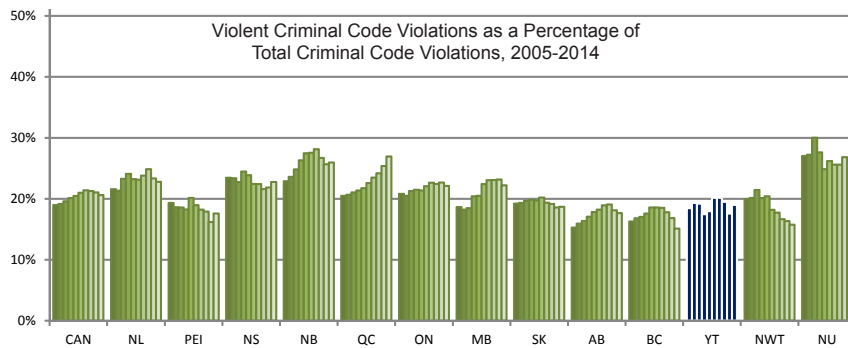
Property crimes involve unlawful acts to gain property, but do not involve the use or threat of violence against the person. They include offences such as break and enter, theft and fraud.

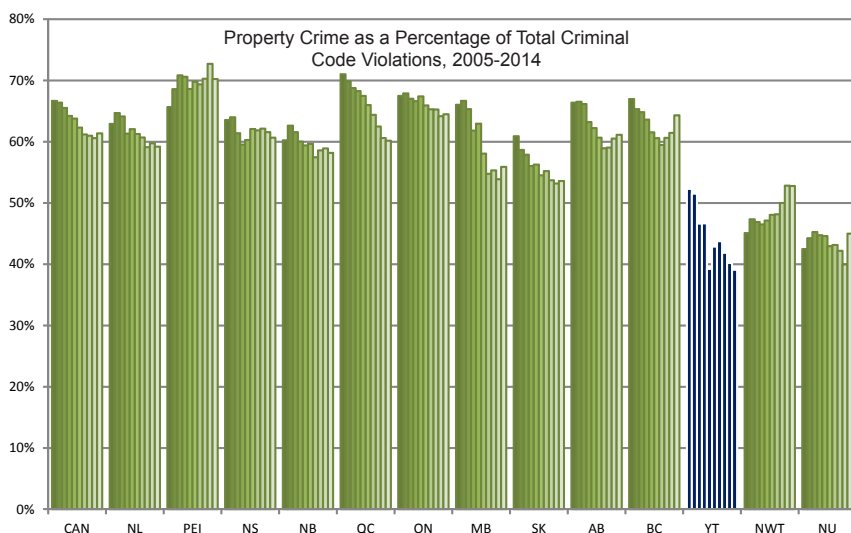
These incidents involve the remaining Criminal Code offences that are not classified as violent or property (excluding traffic offences). Examples are mischief, bail violations, disturbing the peace, arson, prostitution and offensive weapons.

Number of Incidents by Violation Type as a Percentage of Total Criminal Code Violations (excluding traffic), Yukon, 2005 to 2014



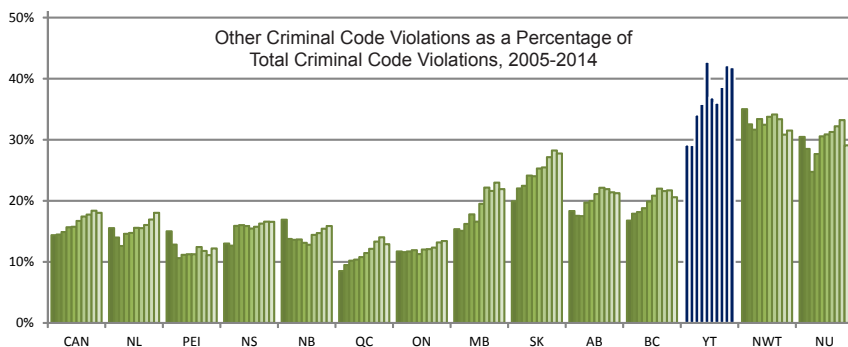
- While the majority of Canadian jurisdictions have seen an upward followed by a downward trend in violent Criminal Code violations as a percentage of total Criminal Code violations, Prince Edward Island and Nova Scotia had an overall downward trend and Quebec had an upward trend. For Yukon, the percentage had an overall declining trend from 2006 to 2008, increased in 2009 and 2010, decreased in 2012 and 2013, and increased again in 2014.

- Over the past ten years, violent Criminal Code violations have averaged 18.9% of all Criminal Code violations in Yukon, the fifth lowest in the country.
- In 2014, there were 1,047 incidents of *assault* levels 1-3 in Yukon, accounting for 63.1% of all violent Criminal Code violations. Collectively, *uttering threats* (259), *threatening or harassing phone calls* (102), and *criminal harassment* (52) accounted for 24.9%. *Sexual assault* levels 1-3 (81) accounted for 4.9% of all violent Criminal Code violations.



- Yukon has experienced an overall downward trend in property crime as a percentage of all Criminal Code violations. With the exceptions of Prince Edward Island, Alberta, British Columbia, Northwest Territories and Nunavut, other jurisdictions also experienced a downward trend.
- On average over the last ten years, property crime has accounted for 44.1% of all Criminal Code violations in Yukon, the second lowest in the country. In 2014, the percentage of property crime in Yukon (39.1%) was the lowest in Canada.

- In 2014, there were 1,990 incidents of *mischief* accounting for 58.3% of all property crime in Yukon. *Theft* (1,074) accounted for 31.4% of all property crime, and *breaking and entering* (210) accounted for 6.1%.



- With the exception of the Northwest Territories, the majority of jurisdictions have seen an overall upward trend in other Criminal Code violations as a percentage of all Criminal Code violations.
- While Yukon's average 'other' Criminal Code violations percentage ranks highest in the country (37.1%) over the last decade, *disturb the peace* incidents have accounted for 70.1% of that figure.

- In 2014, there were 2,634 incidents of *disturb the peace* accounting for 72.0% of all 'other' Criminal Code violations in Yukon. *Administration of justice violations* incidents (840) accounted for 23.0%.

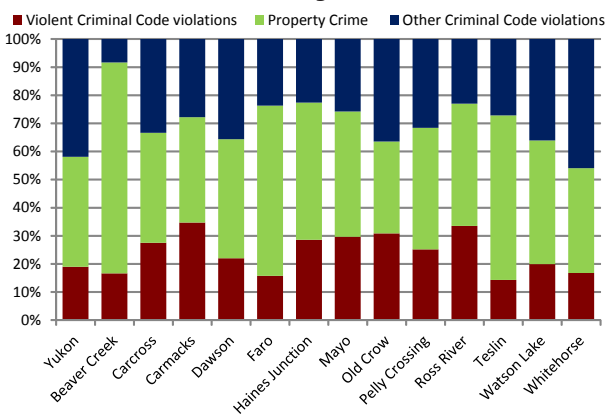
The number of actual incidents refers to the total number of incidents reported to the police minus incidents proven to be unfounded following preliminary investigation in any given year. Police-reported statistics may be affected by differences in the way police services deal with minor offences. In some instances, police or municipalities might choose to deal with some minor offences using municipal by-laws or provincial provisions rather than Criminal Code provisions. Differences in Police service's priorities, policies, procedures and enforcement practices may also have an effect.

Prior to the 2012 Police-reported Crime Statistics in Yukon report, Yukon Bureau of Statistics' crime publications contained microdata obtained directly from the Yukon RCMP office. Records management systems changed in 2004, and the publication was discontinued. Community-level data is now available via Statistics Canada CANSIM tables 252-0051 and 252-0082. As a result of these changes, the 2012 and 2013 reports as well as this publication (2014) are not comparable with previous ones.

Populations are based upon July 1 estimates from Statistics Canada, Demography Division.
