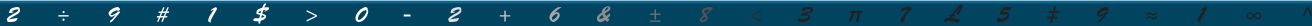

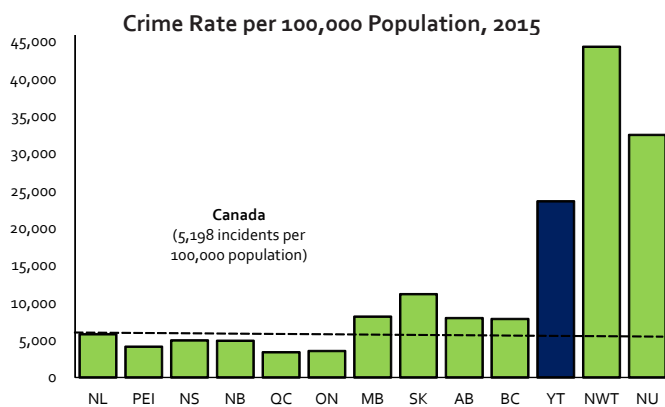
Police-reported Crime Statistics in Yukon 2015

This report is based on data released by Statistics Canada from the incident-based Uniform Crime Reporting Survey (UCR). The UCR collects information on all criminal incidents (of adults and youth) reported to, and substantiated by, Canadian police services.

Highlights:

- A total of 9,696 criminal incidents were reported to police in Yukon in 2015: 1,533 violent Criminal Code violations; 3,604 property crime; 3,698 'other' Criminal Code violations; 523 Criminal Code traffic violations; and 338 Federal Statutes violations.
- Yukon's 2015 police-reported crime rate (23,605 incidents per 100,000 population) was 0.1% lower than the 2014 rate (23,628 incidents per 100,000).

Crime Rate, Canada, Provinces and Territories, 2015



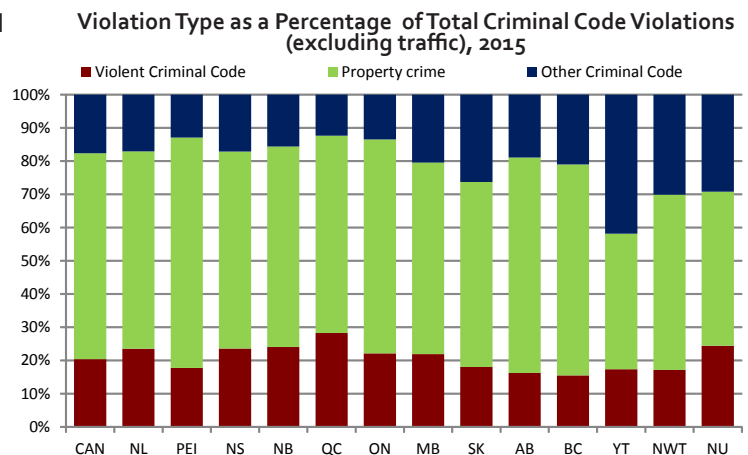
- Yukon's 2015 crime rate was the third highest in the country at 23,605 incidents per 100,000 population (Yukon's population as of July 1, 2015 was 37,428).
- In 2015, the crime rate decreased 0.1% compared to 2014 (23,628 incidents per 100,000). However, the 2015 crime rate was 18.5% higher than the 2006 rate (19,925 incidents per 100,000).

Criminal Code traffic violations, as well as federal statute violations are not included in the calculation of the crime rate.

Crime counts are based on the most serious offence in an incident; however, violent criminal incidents are generally counted separately for each victim.

Criminal Code Violations (excluding traffic), Canada, Provinces and Territories, 2015

- In 2015, there were 8,835 actual incidents of Criminal Code violations (excluding traffic) in Yukon. Of this total, 17.4% were violent Criminal Code violations (1,533 incidents); 40.8% were property crimes (3,604); and 41.9% were 'other' Criminal Code violations* (3,698). In terms of the *proportion of total incidents*:
 - Yukon ranked the fourth lowest in the country for violent Criminal Code violations,
 - the lowest in the country for property crimes, and
 - the highest in Canada for 'other' Criminal Code violations.
- The above Yukon proportions compare nationally at: 20.4% violent Criminal Code violations; 61.9% property crime; and 17.6% 'other' Criminal Code violations.



** While 'other' Criminal Code violations typically include counterfeiting, weapons violations, child pornography, prostitution, disturb the peace and administration of justice, etc., these 'other' violations for Yukon (3,698 incidents) mainly included disturb the peace (2,638 incidents) and administration of justice (930 incidents).*

¹ Sexual violations against children crime category has only partial data available prior to 2008. As a result, numbers should not be directly compared to data from previous years. Includes: sexual interference, invitation to sexual touching, sexual exploitation, making sexually explicit material available to children for the purpose of facilitating sexual offences against children/youth, luring a child via a computer/agreement or arrangement, and, as of December 2014, the offences of parent or guardian procuring sexual activity (Criminal Code, s. 170), and householder permitting prohibited sexual activity (Criminal Code, s. 171).

² Includes non-consensual distribution of intimate images.

³ Total commodification of sexual activity violations includes: the purchasing of sexual services or communicating for that purpose, receiving a material benefit deriving from the purchase of sexual services, procuring of persons for the purpose of prostitution, and advertising sexual services offered for sale as well as reclassification of Parent or guardian procuring sexual activity, and Householder permitting prohibited sexual activity.

Crimes against the person involve the use or threatened use of violence against a person, including homicide, attempted murder, assault, sexual assault and robbery. Robbery is considered a crime against the person because unlike other theft offences it involves the use or threat of violence.

¹ In April 2011, legislation came into effect making it an offence to traffic in property obtained by crime, including possession with intent to traffic property obtained by crime.

² In January 2010, the UCR survey was modified to create new violation codes for identity fraud and identity theft. Prior to 2010, those offences would have been coded as fraud.

Property crimes involve unlawful acts to gain property, but do not involve the use or threat of violence against the person. They include offences such as break and enter, theft and fraud.

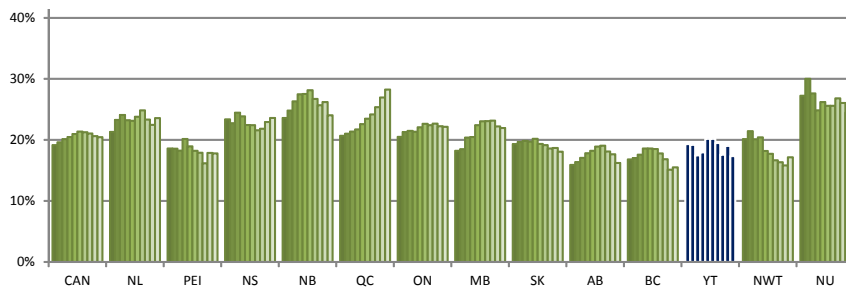

¹ Includes: communicating to provide sexual services for consideration; and stopping or impeding traffic for the purpose of offering, providing or obtaining sexual services for consideration.

These incidents involve the remaining Criminal Code offences that are not classified as violent or property (excluding traffic offences). Examples are mischief, bail violations, disturbing the peace, arson, prostitution and offensive weapons.

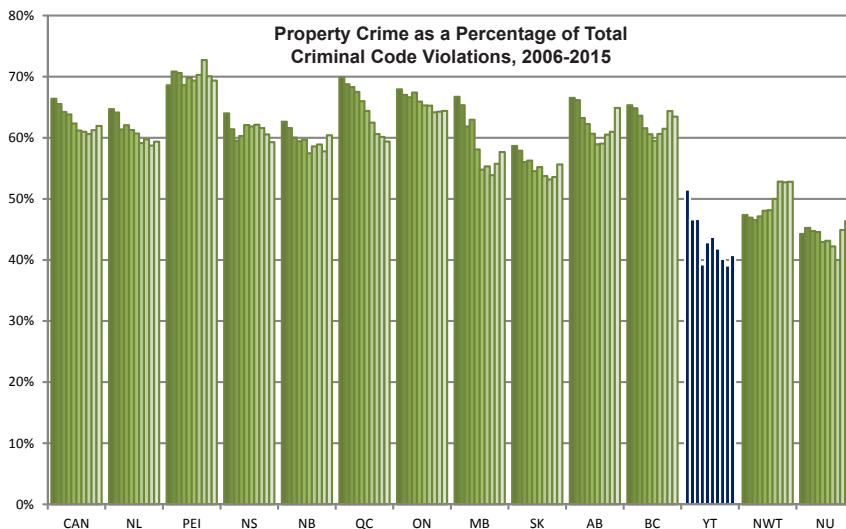
Number of Incidents by Violation Type as a Percentage of Total Criminal Code Violations (excluding traffic), Yukon, 2006 to 2015

Violent Criminal Code Violations as a Percentage of Total Criminal Code Violations, 2006-2015



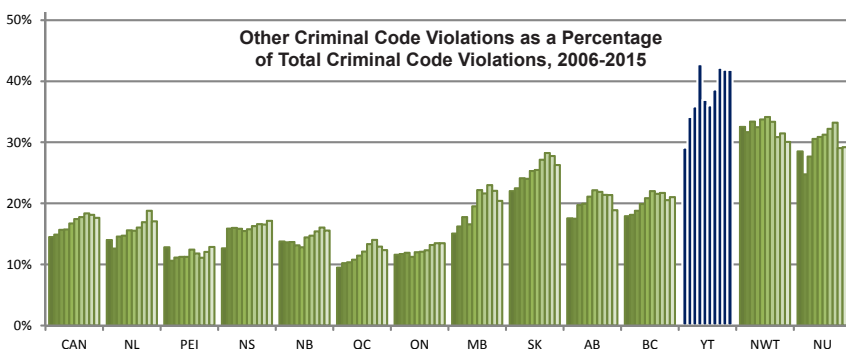
- Yukon's violent Criminal Code violations as a percentage of total Criminal Code violations ranged from 17.4% to 20.2% over the past ten years. The percentage declined between 2006 and 2008, increased in 2009 and 2010, remained unchanged in 2011, then decreased again in each of the following two years. The proportion increased in 2014 before decreasing again in 2015 to its lowest percentage (17.4%) in the past ten years.

- Comparing 2015 to 2014, the majority of Canadian jurisdictions (8) had a decrease in the proportion of violent Criminal Code violations ranging from -0.1% in Prince Edward Island and Ontario, to -2.1% in New Brunswick. The remaining jurisdictions (5) had an increase in the proportion: Quebec (+1.3%), Northwest Territories (+1.3%), Newfoundland (+1.1%), Nova Scotia (+0.7%), and British Columbia (+0.4%).
- In 2015, there were 970 incidents of *assault* levels 1-3 in Yukon, accounting for 63.3% of all violent Criminal Code violations. Collectively, *uttering threats* (262), *indecent/harassing communications* (61), and *criminal harassment* (49) accounted for 24.3%. *Sexual assault* levels 1-3 (90) accounted for 5.9% of all violent Criminal Code violations.



- The proportion of property crime to Yukon's total Criminal Code violations exhibited an overall downward trend in the last ten years. (During the same period, the number of property crimes increased from 3,313 in 2006 to 3,604 in 2015; see the relevant table on page 2.)

- Comparing 2015 to 2014, the majority of Canadian jurisdictions (8) had an increase in the proportion of property crime to total Criminal Code violations ranging from 0.1% in Ontario to 3.9% in Alberta. In 2015, Yukon's proportion of property crime (40.8%) was the lowest in Canada.
- In 2015, there were 1,974 incidents of *mischievous* accounting for 54.8% of all property crime in Yukon. *Theft* (1,145) accounted for 31.8% of all property crime, and *breaking and entering* (300) accounted for 8.3%.



- The share of Yukon's 'other' Criminal Code violations to total Criminal Code violations increased over the past ten years. While the share for Yukon was the highest in the country (41.9%) in 2015, *disturb the peace* accounted for 71.3% of the total number of 'other' violations.

- For most jurisdictions, the share of 'other' violations in total Criminal Code violations decreased in 2015.
- In 2015, there were 2,638 incidents of *disturb the peace* accounting for 71.3% of all 'other' Criminal Code violations in Yukon. *Administration of justice violations* incidents (930) accounted for 25.1%.

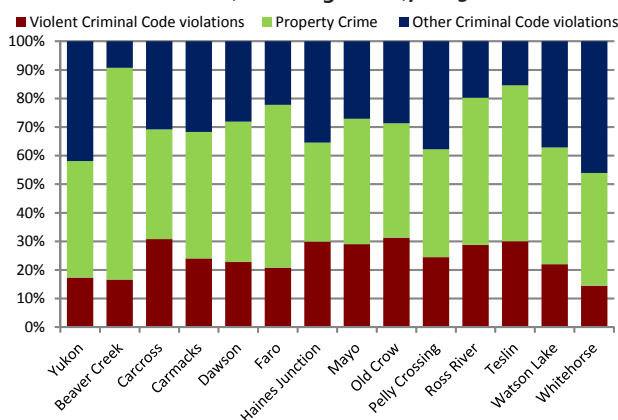
The number of actual incidents refers to the total number of incidents reported to the police minus incidents proven to be unfounded following preliminary investigation in any given year. Police-reported statistics may be affected by differences in the way police services deal with minor offences. In some instances, police or municipalities might choose to deal with some minor offences using municipal by-laws or provincial provisions rather than Criminal Code provisions. Differences in Police service's priorities, policies, procedures and enforcement practices may also have an effect.

Prior to the 2012 Police-reported Crime Statistics in Yukon report, Yukon Bureau of Statistics' crime publications contained microdata obtained directly from the Yukon RCMP office. Records management systems changed in 2004, and the publication was discontinued. Community-level data is now available via Statistics Canada CANSIM tables 252-0051 and 252-0082. As a result of these changes, the 2012 to 2015 reports are not comparable with previous ones.

Populations are based upon July 1 estimates from Statistics Canada, Demography Division.
