

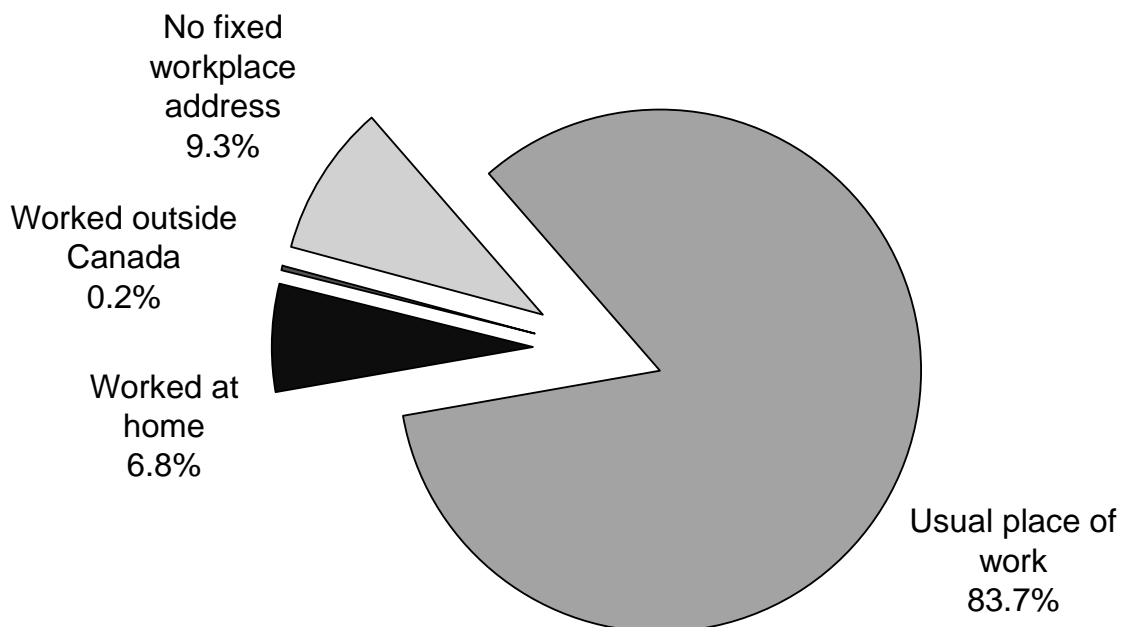
## Place of Work

The following statistics are from the 1996 Census of Canada which occurred on May 14, 1996.

### 1 Highlights

- ◆ Most employed Yukoners (83.7%) reported to a usual place of work, outside the home.
- ◆ Older age groups were more likely to work at home. Only 3.8% of 15 to 24 year old employed Yukoners worked at home compared with 23.8% of those 65 and over.
- ◆ Men were more likely than women to report no fixed workplace address (men 14.3%, women 3.8%), and women were more likely to report to a usual place of work (89.1% women, 78.7% men).
- ◆ Yukoners who worked at home were more likely than those reporting to a usual place of work to have incomes less than \$30,000. Of those who worked at home, 28.5% had incomes less than \$10,000, compared with 15.6% of those who reported to a usual place of work. Only 6.1% of Yukoners who worked at home had incomes of \$60,000 and over, compared with 14.0% of those who reported to a usual place of work.

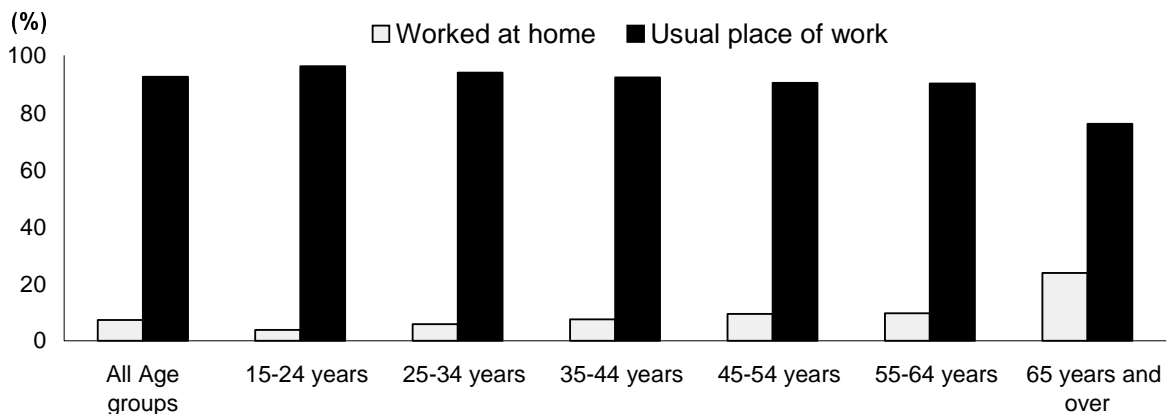

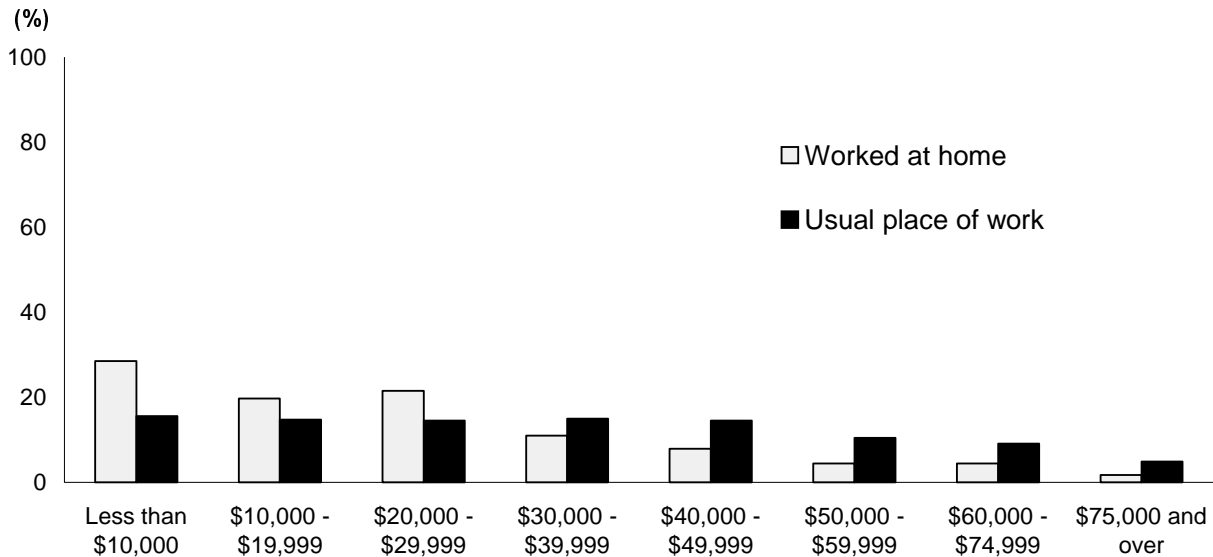

## Notes

**Place of work status:** Refers to the place of work of non-institutional residents 15 years of age and over who have worked since January 1, 1995. The variable usually relates to the individual's job held in the week prior to enumeration. However, if the person had not worked during that week but had worked at some time since January 1, 1995, the information relates to the job held longest during that period.

**Worked at home:** Persons whose job is located in the same building as their place of residence, persons who live and work on the same farm, and teleworkers who spend most of their work week working at home.

**Worked outside Canada:** Persons who work as diplomats, Armed Forces personnel and other persons enumerated abroad. Includes also recent immigrants who may not currently be employed but whose job of longest duration since January 1, 1995 was held outside Canada.

**No fixed workplace:** Persons who do not go from home to the same workplace location at the beginning of each shift. Such persons include building and landscape contractors, travelling salespersons, independent truck drivers, etc.

**Usual place of work:** Persons who are not included in the categories described above and who report to the same (usual) workplace location at the beginning of each shift.
