

IN BRIEF:

Projections for the Yukon's population in 2014 estimate:

- Low-growth: a population of **28,624**; or,
- Medium-growth: a population of **31,946**; or,
- High-growth: a population of **35,421**.

The current population of the Yukon (June 2004) is 30,469.

HOW WILL THE YUKON'S POPULATION CHANGE BY 2014?

Low-growth projection

- Total population would fall by 1,845, or 6.1%.
- The number of aboriginal people in the Yukon would increase by 355, or 5.2%.
- The number of non-aboriginal people in the Yukon would fall by 2,200, or 9.3%.
- The number of women in the Yukon would decrease by 192, or 1.3%, while the number of men would decrease by 1,653, or 10.9%.
- Changes in the age distribution of the Yukon show that all age groups 50 and over would increase, as well as the age group 25-to-29, while all age groups 49 and under (with the exception of 25-to-29) would decrease.

Medium-growth projection

- Total population would increase by 1,477, or 4.8%.
- The number of aboriginal people in the Yukon would increase by 871, or 12.7%.
- The number of non-aboriginal people in the Yukon would increase by 606, or 2.6%.
- The number of women in the Yukon would increase by 1,237, or 8.1%, while the number of men would increase by 240, or 1.6%.
- Changes in the age distribution of the Yukon show that all age groups 50+ would increase, while six of ten age groups below 50 would decrease. The 40-to-44-year-old age group would decrease the most (31.3%), while the 65-to-69-year-old age group would exhibit the largest increase (121.3%).

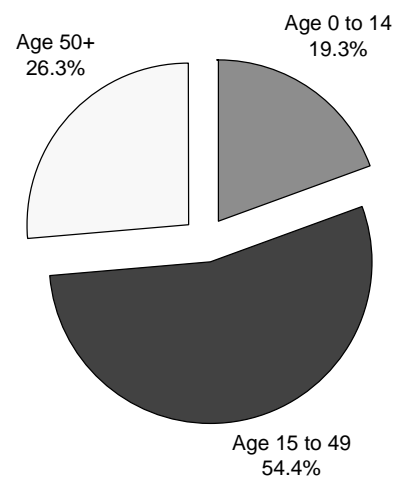
High-growth projection

- Total population would increase by 4,952, or 16.3%.
- The number of aboriginal people in the Yukon would increase by 1,456, or 21.2%.
- The number of non-aboriginal people in the Yukon would increase by 3,496, or 14.8%.
- The number of women in the Yukon would increase by 2,755, or 18.0%, while the number of men would increase by 2,197, or 14.5%.
- Changes in the age distribution of the Yukon show that all age groups 50+ would increase. Four age groups would decrease. The greatest decrease would be in the

40-to-44-year-old age group (21.1%). The largest increase would be in the 65-to-69-year-old age group (129.5%).

IMPLICATIONS FOR THE FUTURE

The current population figures show the following age breakdown:



Each projection for the Yukon's population in 2014 shows a larger and older population in the Yukon:

- The **Low-growth projection** shows the 50+ age groups comprising **39.6%** of the population by 2014;
- The **Medium-growth projection** shows the 50+ age groups comprising **37.4%** of the population by 2014; and
- The **High-growth projection** shows the 50+ age groups comprising **35.6%** of the population by 2014.

LOW-GROWTH POPULATION PROJECTION: Detail

The following tables show the LOW growth projection as it compares to the Yukon's population as of June 2004. Figures are presented by ethnicity (aboriginal/non-aboriginal), by gender and by age. Differences are shown in actual numbers and as percentages.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- Fertility rates are down 10%.
- Mortality rates are constant.
- Net migration each year is -300.

The above table shows changes in the Yukon's non-aboriginal population.

- There would be 2,200, or 9.3%, fewer non-aboriginal Yukoners in 2014 compared to 2004.
- Most of the decline would be in the 10-to-19 and the 35-to-49-year-old age groups, with all age groups over 55 showing growth.

The above table shows changes in the Yukon's aboriginal population.

- Overall, the aboriginal population would increase by 355, or 5.2%
- Highest growth would be in the 65-to-69 (92.4%) age group, and the largest decline would be in the 40-to-44 (-26.8%) age group.

- The table at the bottom of the previous column (low-growth projection for the Yukon's female population) shows that the female population would decrease 1.3%, to 15,093, by the year 2014.
- All age groups 50 and over would increase, with the 65-to-69 age group increasing the most, by 131%.
- With the exception of 25-to-29 year-olds, all age groups under 50 would decrease in population.

- The number of male Yukoners would decline by 1,653, or 10.9%, by the year 2014.
- Only one age group below 55 would increase (25-to-29-year olds, by 8.2%), with all age groups 55 and over increasing.
- The largest percentage decrease would be in the 40-to-44-year-old age group, which would decline by 628 men, or 43.8%.

MEDIUM-GROWTH POPULATION PROJECTION: Detail

The following tables show the MEDIUM growth projection as it compares to the Yukon's population as of June 2004. Figures are presented by ethnicity (aboriginal/non-aboriginal), by gender and by age. Differences are shown in actual numbers and as percentages.

- Net migration each year is zero.

The above table shows changes in the Yukon's non-aboriginal population.

- There would be 606, or 2.6%, more non-aboriginal Yukoners in 2014 compared to 2004.
- The 55-to-59, 60-to-64 and 65-to-69-year-old age groups show significant increases (a total of 2,493 people).
- The largest decrease, 858 people, would be in the 45-to-49 age group.

- Overall, the aboriginal population would increase by 871, or 12.7%.
- Highest growth would be in the 65-to-69 (97.5%) age group and the largest decline would be in the 40-to-44 (19.3%) age group.

- The table at the bottom of the previous column would see the medium-growth projection for the Yukon's female population increase 8.1% to 16,522 by the year 2014.
- All age groups 50 and over would increase, the 65-to-69-year-old group by 466 people or 137.5%.
- Six female age groups would decrease: 10-to-14 (21.7%), 15-to-19 (20.5%), 20-to-24 (0.3%), 35-to-39 (20.1%), 40-to-44 (31.7%) and 45-to-49 (22.9%) year-olds.

- The number of male Yukoners would increase by 240, or 1.6%, by the year 2014.
- The age groups with the largest percentage increases would be the 65-to-69 (108.7%), 80+ (71.8%) and 70-to-74 (70.7%) age groups.

- Mortality rates are down 10%.
- Net migration each year is +300.

- There would be 3,496, or 14.8%, more non-aboriginal Yukoners in 2014 compared to 2004.
- The vast majority of the total increase would be in age groups 50 and over.

- The table at the bottom of the previous column would see the high-growth projection for the Yukon's female population increase 18.0%, to 18,040, by the year 2014.
- All age groups 50 and over would increase, the 65-to-69-year-old group the most (by 144.0%).

- The number of male Yukoners would increase by 2,197, or 14.5%, by the year 2014.
- Only five age groups would decrease: 10-to-14 (24.6%), 15-to-19 (25.4%), 35-to-39 (3.9%), 40-to-44 (17.4%) and 45-to-49 (12.0%) year-olds.
- The age group with both the largest number and percentage increase would be the 65-to-69 age group, increasing by 516 men, or 118.3%.
