
YUKON BUREAU OF STATISTICS

Population Report March 2014

Highlights:

- The estimated population of Yukon in March 2014 was 36,623; a decrease of 171, or 0.5%, compared to March 2013 (36,794).
- Comparing March 2014 to March 2004, Yukon's estimated population increased by 6,262, or 20.6%. The population of Whitehorse increased by 5,396, or 23.9%; Dawson City increased by 208, or 11.7%; and Watson Lake decreased by 92, or 5.9%.

All figures in this publication were calculated by Yukon Bureau of Statistics based on data obtained from several Yukon government administrative records.


- Yukon's population declined steadily between 1997 and 2001, and then fluctuated around 30,000 between 2001 and 2003.
- Since 2004, the population has been increasing at a steady pace. Successive new record highs¹ within most quarters have been set since the second half of 2008, the most recent being May 2013 at 36,816.

¹Accurate population estimates during the Gold Rush are not available. However, the first Census population estimate for Yukon was 27,219 in 1901.

Population by Age Group and Sex, Yukon, March 2004 and March 2014



Yukon's population has grown and aged since 2003 — particularly as the baby-boom (current age 48-67) and echo-boom populations (current age 21-41) have aged.

March 2014 figures show:

- 16.6% of Yukon's population was under 15 years of age, 73.0% was between 15 and 64 years, and 10.3% was 65 years of age or older. In March 2004, 19.4% of Yukon's population was under 15 years of age, 73.9% was between 15 and 64 years, and 6.7% was 65 years and over.
- Yukon's population consisted of 18,734 males (51.2%) and 17,889 females (48.8%). In March 2004, the gender gap was slightly less: males comprised 49.8% of Yukon's population; females 50.2%.




³ Outside City Limits-North includes those residents living from Takhini River Bridge up to and including Fox Lake.

⁵ Outside City Limits-West includes those residents living from the Mayo Road Cut-off up to and including Mendenhall.


Annual (June) Population Estimates and Growth

Yukon's annual (June) population increased by 6,550, from 29,976 in June 2003 to 36,526 in June 2013. This represents a compound annual growth rate of 2.2%. However, this growth has not occurred evenly from year to year. It ranges from a growth of 3.4% between 2007 and 2008 to a decline of 0.9% between 2002 and 2003.

In June 2013, the First Nations population (self-reported) in Yukon was estimated at 7,651. Of this total, 4,179 (54.6%) resided in Whitehorse, while 3,473 (45.4%) resided in rural communities. First Nations represented 20.9% of the total Yukon population.

The self-reported First Nations population increased by 911, from 6,740 in June 2003 to 7,651 in June 2013. This represents a compound annual growth rate of 1.4%; ranging from a 3.1% increase between 2004 and 2005 to a decrease of 2.4% between 2010 and 2011.

Notes

Prior to 2012, the Yukon Bureau of Statistics produced population estimates twice a year. Effective 2012, estimates are produced quarterly.

Official population estimates for months and years prior to June 2010 were based on raw counts by mailing address of Yukon Health Care Insurance Plan recipients, adjusted using the results of a semi-annual health care update survey that estimated the number of recipients who were no longer Yukon residents. Population estimates are now based on a model that combines raw counts by mailing address of Yukon Health Care Insurance Plan recipients, health insurance claims and motor vehicle registrations. The model is calibrated through Statistics Canada's Census of Population ratio applications. The most recent adjusted Census of Population data applied is from 2011.

Figures are sorted by postal codes and community codes. Users of this information should be aware that community population estimates include not only the legally defined municipal limits, but also the population that lives in the immediately surrounding area.
