## Population Report March 2015

### Highlights:

- The estimated population of Yukon in March 2015 was 37,178; an increase of 350, or 1.0%, compared to the revised figure for March 2014 (36,828).
- Comparing March 2015 to March 2005, Yukon's estimated population increased by 6,104, or 19.6%. The population of the Whitehorse area increased by 5,295, or 22.6%; Dawson City increased by 227, or 12.5%; and Watson Lake decreased by 60, or 3.9%.

**Notes on methodological changes:** Prior to 2012, the Yukon Bureau of Statistics produced population figures twice a year. Effective 2012, figures are produced quarterly.

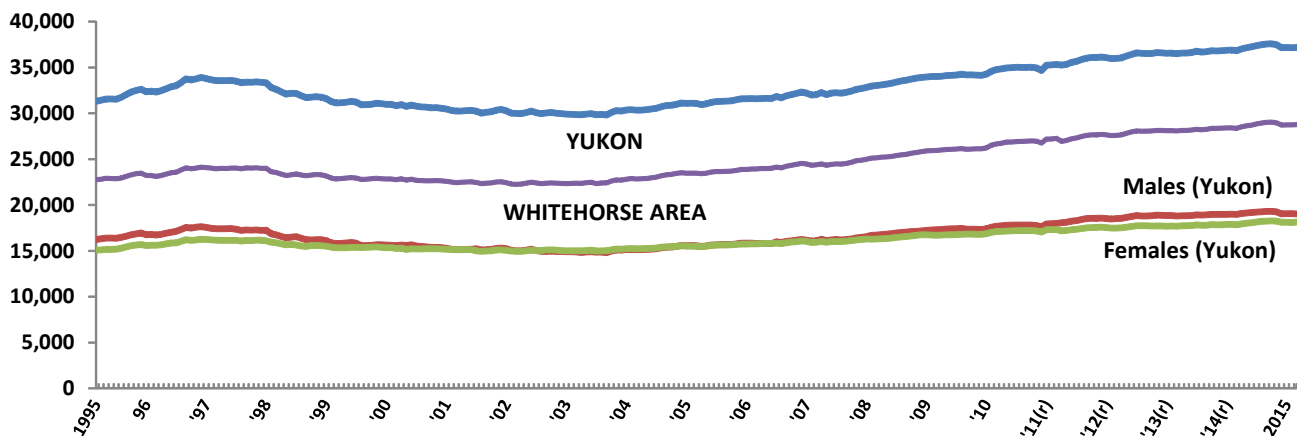
Official population counts prior to June 2010 were based on information in Yukon Health Care Insurance Plan (YHCIP) files and a semi-annual health care update survey that estimated the number of plan members who were no longer Yukon residents. In 2010, the estimation model was revised and the population counts for June 2010 through December 2014 were derived by tracking changes in YHCIP files and other administrative data files. In 2015, the model was further revised to make the approach more comprehensive and to improve accuracy based on information in all available and applicable administrative data files of the Yukon government. In addition, the total population count of April 2011 was calibrated to a census-based estimate adjusted for net undercoverage.

The new model assigns residents of unorganized areas to their nearest communities. Estimates for Whitehorse now include population in surrounding areas *as well as in Marsh Lake* to remain comparable with the geographical area defined by Statistics Canada as the Whitehorse Census Agglomeration.

All monthly estimates are as of the last day of the month. The June estimates represent annual figures.

Due to the change in methodology in 2015, revised figures presented in this publication for the period from April 2011 to December 2014 are not strictly comparable to figures prior to the period. Revised population estimates for First Nations will be published in the September 2015 Population Report.

### Monthly Population, March 1995 to March 2015



- Yukon's population declined steadily from 1997 to 2001, and then fluctuated around 30,000 from 2001 to 2003.
- From 2004 through to 2014, the population increased almost steadily with successive record highs<sup>1</sup> within most quarters until December of 2014, when the population decreased by over 300.
- The March 2015 population for Yukon was 37,178, an increase of 17 people compared to the revised December 2014 figure of 37,161. Compared to the revised March 2014 figure (36,828), the March 2015 population increased by 350 people, or 1.0%.

<sup>1</sup> Accurate population counts during the Gold Rush are not available. However, the first Census population figure for Yukon was 27,219 in 1901.

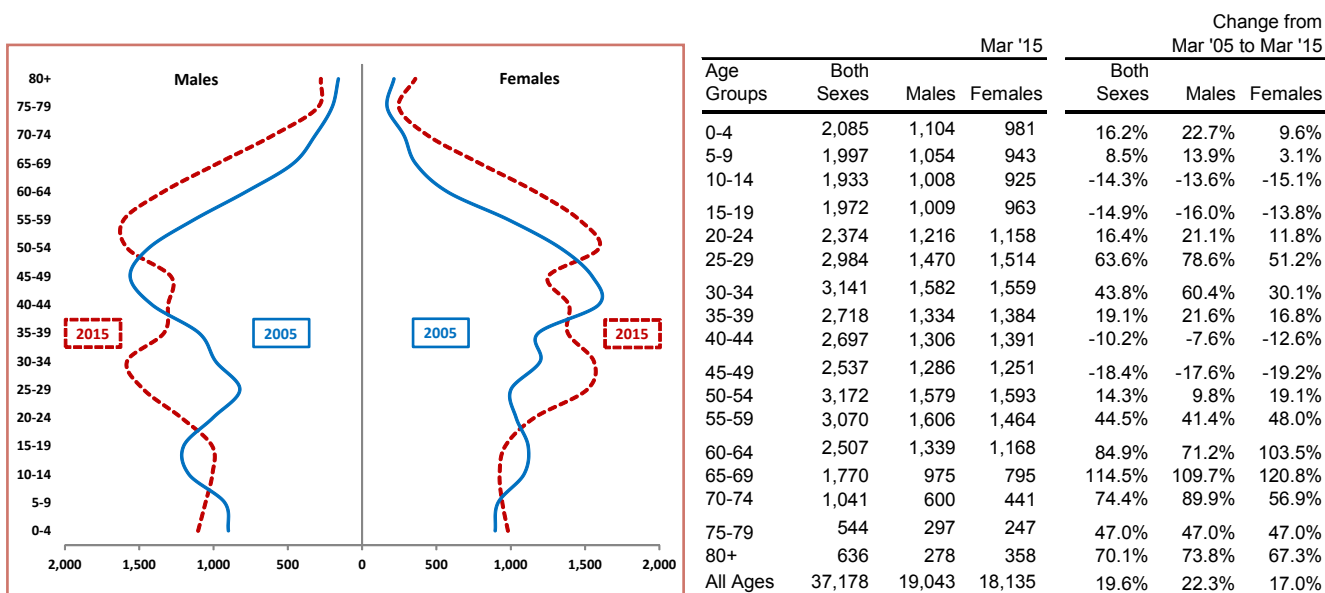

- Yukon's population during the first three months of 2015 remained almost unchanged.
- Comparing the first three months of 2015 to their respective 2014 months, populations increased 0.8% in January, 0.7% in February and 1.0% in March.

## Population by Age Group and Sex, Yukon, March 2005 and March 2015



Comparing March 2015 to March 2005, growth occurred as follows (15 year age groupings):

- 0 to 14 years = 125 people, or 2.1%;
- 15 to 29 years = 1,148 people, or 18.6%;
- 30 to 44 years = 1,086 people, or 14.5%;
- 45 to 59 years = 769 people, 9.6%;
- 60 to 75 years = 2,540 or 91.4%
- 75 years and over = 436 people, or 58.6%

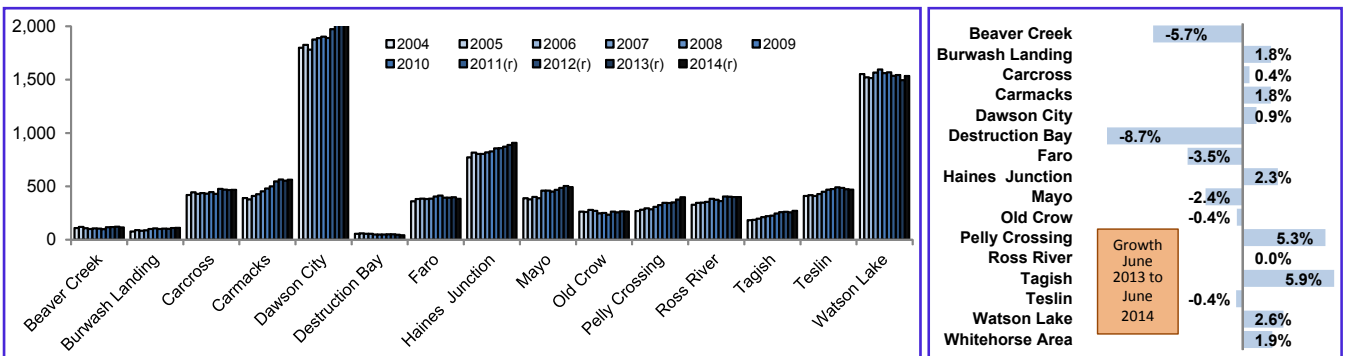

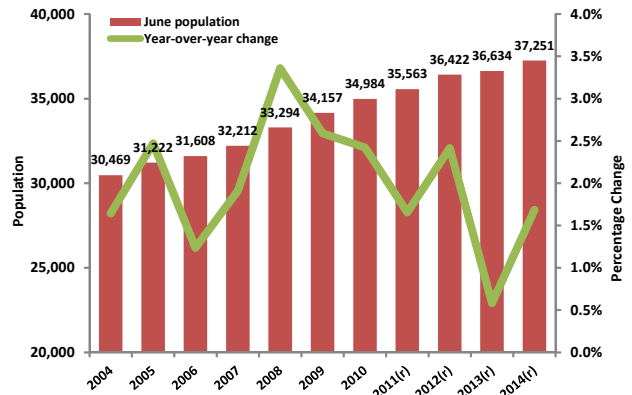

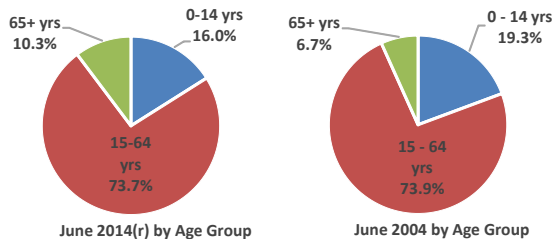


## Annual (June) Population and Growth, Yukon, 2004 to 2014

Yukon's annual (June) population increased by 6,782, from 30,469 in June 2004 to 37,251 (revised) in June 2014. This represents a revised compound annual growth rate of 2.0%. However, this growth has not occurred evenly from year to year. It ranged from a revised low of 0.6% from 2013 to 2014 to a high of 3.4% from 2007 to 2008.

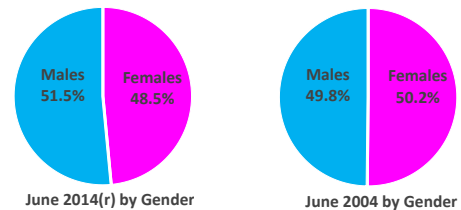


Yukon's population has grown and aged since 2004 – particularly as the baby-boom (current age 50-69) and echo-boom populations (current age 23-43) have aged.

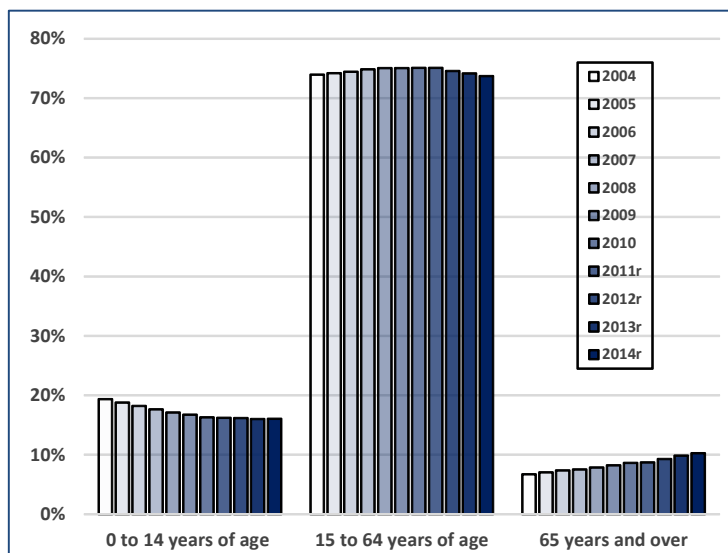


- In June 2014 (revised), 16.0% of Yukon's population was under 15 years of age, 73.7% was between 15 and 64 years, and 10.3% was 65 years of age or older.
- In June 2004, 19.3% of Yukon's population was under 15 years of age, 73.9% was between 15 and 64 years, and 6.7% was 65 years and over.

- In June 2014 (revised), Yukon's population consisted of 19,183 males (51.5%) and 18,068 females (48.5%).
- In June 2004, the gender gap was almost non-existent: there were 15,184 males (49.8%) and 15,285 females (50.2%).



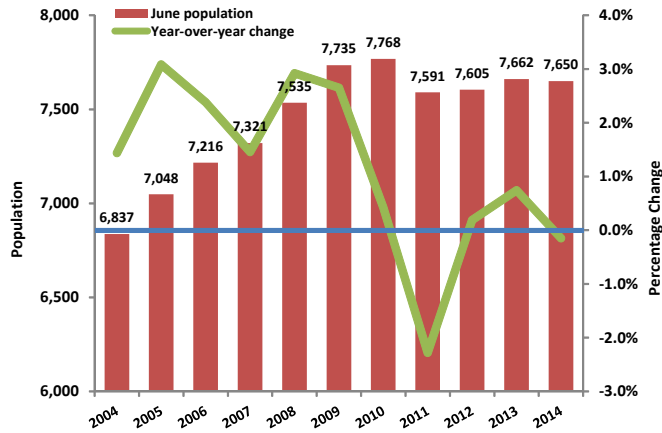
## Annual (June) Population by Broad Age Groups, Yukon, 2004 to 2014



Broad age groups, as a percentage of Yukon's annual (June) population, have shown that:

- the 0-14 age group has decreased from a 19.3% share of the total population in 2004 to a 16.0% share in 2014 (revised); a decrease of 3.3 percentage points.
- the 65+ age group has increased from 6.7% of the total population in 2004 to 10.3% in 2014 (revised); an increase of 3.6 percentage points.

## Annual (June) First Nations Population and Growth, 2004 to 2014



The self-reported First Nations population increased by 813, from 6,837 in June 2004 to 7,650 in June 2014. This represents a compound annual growth rate of 1.1%. The annual growth rate ranged from a low of -2.3% between 2010 and 2011 to a high of 3.1% between 2004 and 2005.

Note: Estimates for First Nation population are updated annually. Figures for 2011 through 2014 will be revised in the September 2015 Population Report.

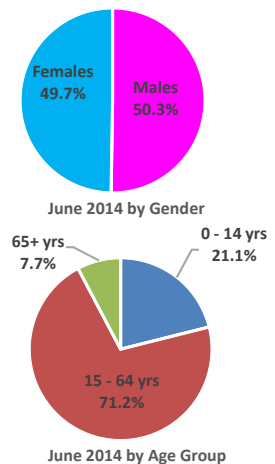

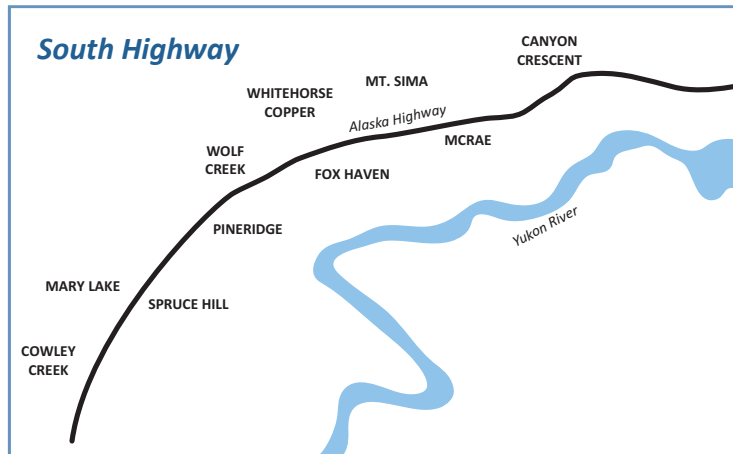
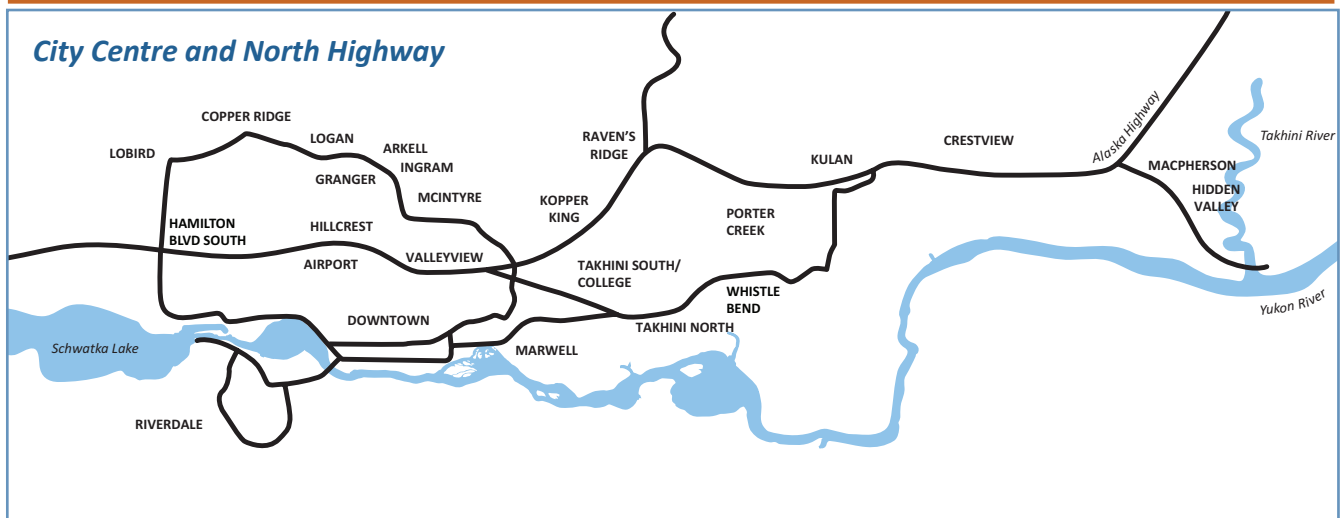
In June 2014, the First Nations population (self-reported) in Yukon was estimated at 7,650. Of this total:

- 3,845 (50.3%) were male; 3,806 were female (49.7%)
- 21.1% were under 15 years of age, 71.2% were between 15 and 64 years, and 7.7% were 65 years of age or older.
- 4,130 (54.0%) resided in Whitehorse, while 3,520 (46.0%) resided in rural communities.

First Nations population (7,650) represented 20.5% of the revised June 2014 Yukon population (37,251). The median age for First Nations was 30 years; for non-First Nations, it was 40.

**Note:** Residents of Whitehorse area are assigned to subdivisions based on their addresses in various administrative files. Some addresses in these files appear inconsistent or incomplete. Efforts have been made to resolve any apparent inconsistency or incompleteness of information by validating the information against multiple sources.

Changes in subdivision populations from one time period to another are not only due to natural population change and migrations, but may also be due to reassignments of previously inaccurate addresses on file.

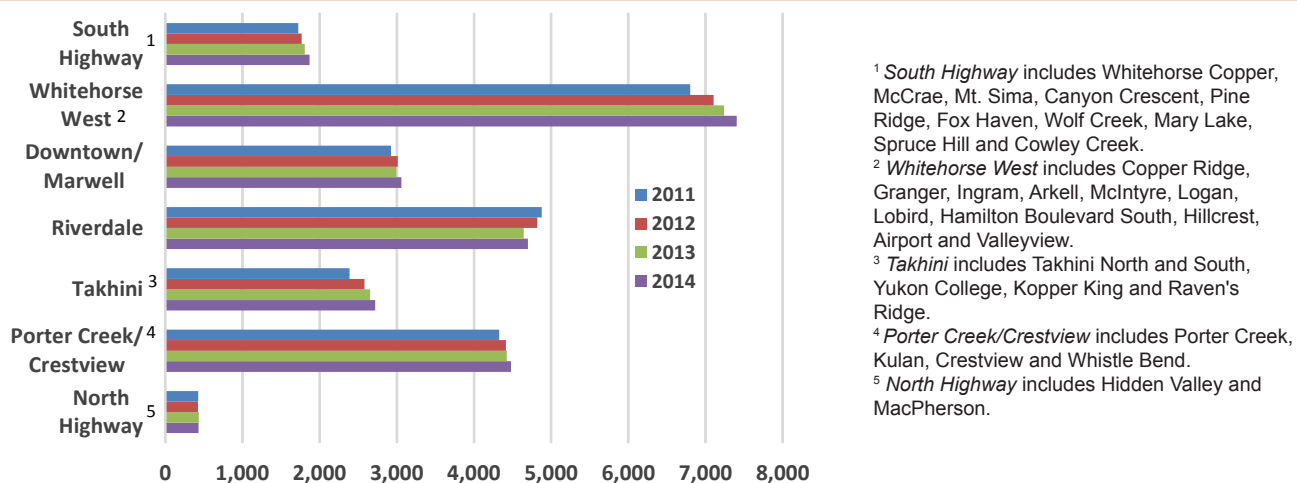

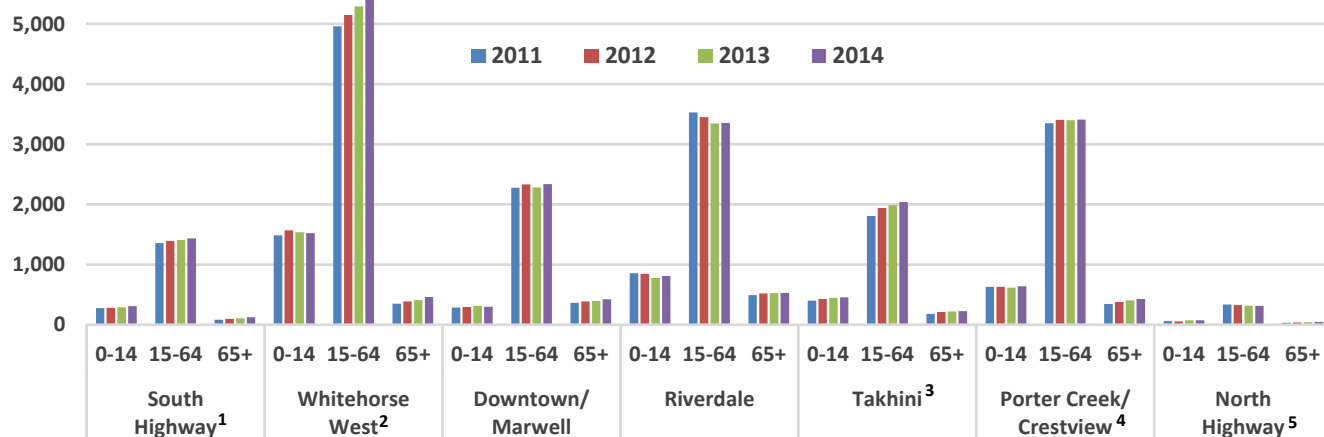

## Annual (June) Population by Aggregated Whitehorse Subdivisions, 2011 to 2014 (within municipal boundaries)



Comparing June 2014 to June 2011, the aggregated subdivision area of Whitehorse West<sup>2</sup> collectively experienced the largest increase in number of residents (604 or 8.9%), followed by the Takhini<sup>3</sup> aggregate area (333 residents; or 13.9% increase). The population of Riverdale, however, decreased by 177 residents, or 3.6%, over the same time period.
