Population Report Third Quarter 2016

Highlights:

- The estimated population of Yukon on September 30, 2016 was 38,200; an increase of 674, or 1.8%, compared to the figure for September 30, 2015 (37,526).
- Comparing September 30, 2016 to September 30, 2006, Yukon's population increased by 6,269, or 19.6%. The population of the Whitehorse area increased by 5,285, or 21.8%; Dawson City increased by 390, or 21.5%; and Watson Lake decreased by 57, or 3.7%.

Notes on methodological changes: Prior to 2012, the Yukon Bureau of Statistics produced population figures twice a year. Effective 2012, figures are produced quarterly.

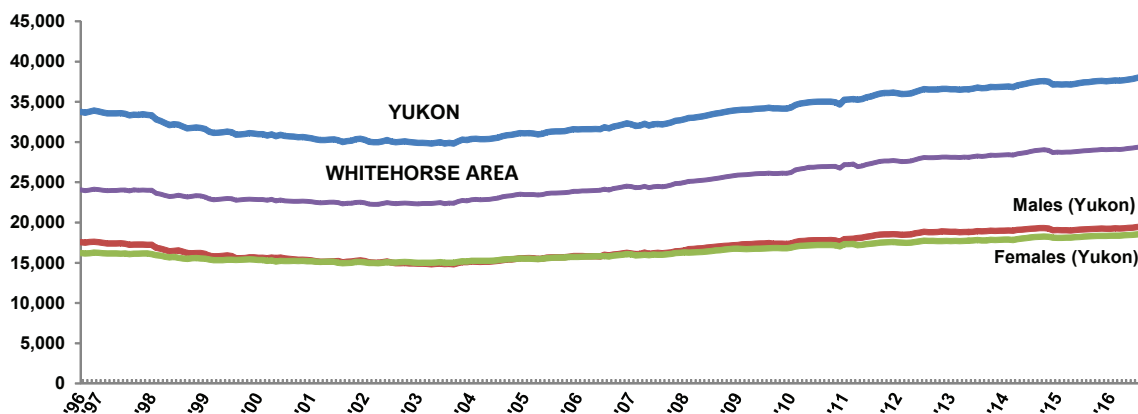
Official population counts prior to June 2010 were based on information in Yukon Health Care Insurance Plan (YHCIP) files and a semi-annual health care update survey that estimated the number of plan members who were no longer Yukon residents. In 2010, the estimation model was revised and the population counts for June 2010 through December 2014 were derived by tracking changes in YHCIP files and other administrative data files. In 2015, the model was further revised to make the approach more comprehensive and to improve accuracy based on information in all available and applicable administrative data files of the Yukon government. In addition, the total population count of April 2011 was calibrated to a census-based estimate adjusted for net undercoverage.

The new model assigns residents of unorganized areas to their nearest communities. Estimates for Whitehorse now include population in surrounding areas *as well as in Marsh Lake* to remain comparable with the geographical area defined by Statistics Canada as the Whitehorse Census Agglomeration.

All monthly estimates are as of the last day of the month. The June estimates represent annual figures.

Due to the change in methodology in 2015, figures presented in this publication for the period from April 2011 to December 2014 are not strictly comparable to figures prior to the period.

Monthly Population, September 30, 1996 to September 30, 2016



- Yukon's population declined steadily from 1997 to 2001, and then fluctuated around 30,000 from 2001 to 2003.
- From 2004 through 2014, the population increased almost steadily with successive record highs¹ in most quarters. However, during the last quarter of 2014, the population decreased by almost 400. The population then remained almost unchanged up to mid-2015 before regaining an upward trend. The September 30, 2016 population at 38,200 is the new record high for Yukon.
- On September 30, 2016, Yukon's population was 38,200, an increase of 342 people, or 0.9%, from June 30, 2016 (37,858), and an increase of 674 people, or 1.8%, from September 30, 2015 (37,526).

¹ Accurate population counts during the Gold Rush are not available. However, the first Census population figure for Yukon was 27,219 in 1901.

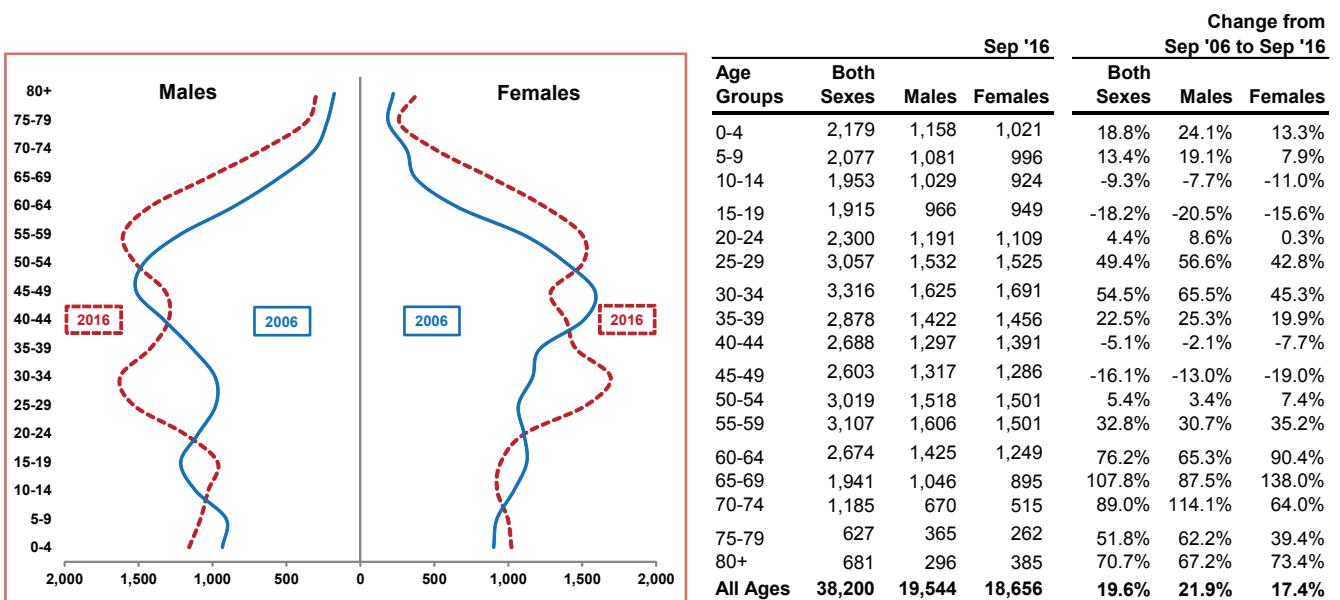

- During the third quarter of 2016, Yukon's population increased by 342 people from 37,858 on June 30, 2016 to 38,200 on September 30, 2016.
- Comparing the months of July through September of 2016 to their respective 2015 months, population increased: 1.5% in July; 1.7% in August; and 1.8% in September.

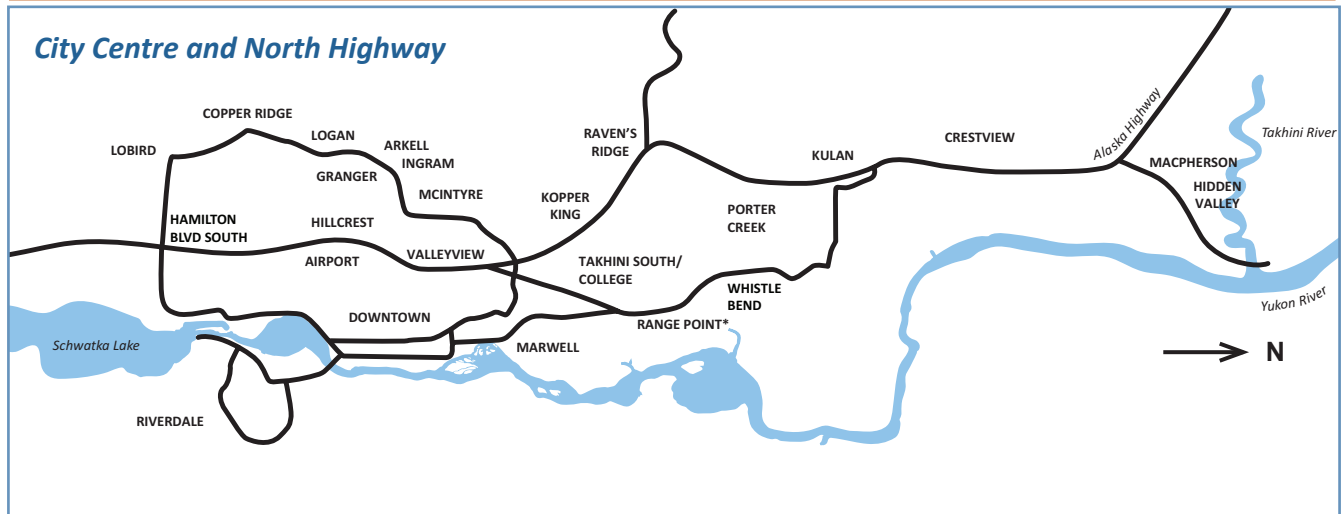
Population by Age Group and Sex, Yukon, September 30, 2006 and September 30, 2016



Comparing September 30, 2016 to September 30, 2006, growth occurred as follows (15-year age groupings):

- 0 to 14 years = 391 people, or 6.7%;
- 15 to 29 years = 683 people, or 10.4%;
- 30 to 44 years = 1,555 people, or 21.2%;
- 45 to 59 years = 423 people, 5.1%;
- 60 to 74 years = 2,721 people, or 88.4%
- 75 years and over = 496 people, or 61.1%.

Note: Residents of Whitehorse area are assigned to subdivisions based on their addresses in various administrative files. Some addresses in these files appear inconsistent or incomplete. Efforts have been made to resolve any apparent inconsistency or incompleteness of information by validating the information against multiple sources.

Changes in subdivision populations from one time period to another are not only due to natural population change and migrations, but may also be due to reassignments of previously inaccurate addresses on file.

² Inconsistent Information includes residents who identified their city of residence as Whitehorse but their addresses recorded in administrative files show inconsistencies. Therefore, there is a possibility that some of these residents may in fact reside outside the Whitehorse area.

³ Outside City Limits-North includes those residents living from Takhini River Bridge up to and including Fox Lake.

⁴ Outside City Limits-South includes those residents living from Carcross Cut-off up to and including Annie Lake Road.

⁵ Outside City Limits-West includes those residents living from the Mayo Road Cut-off up to and including Mendenhall.
