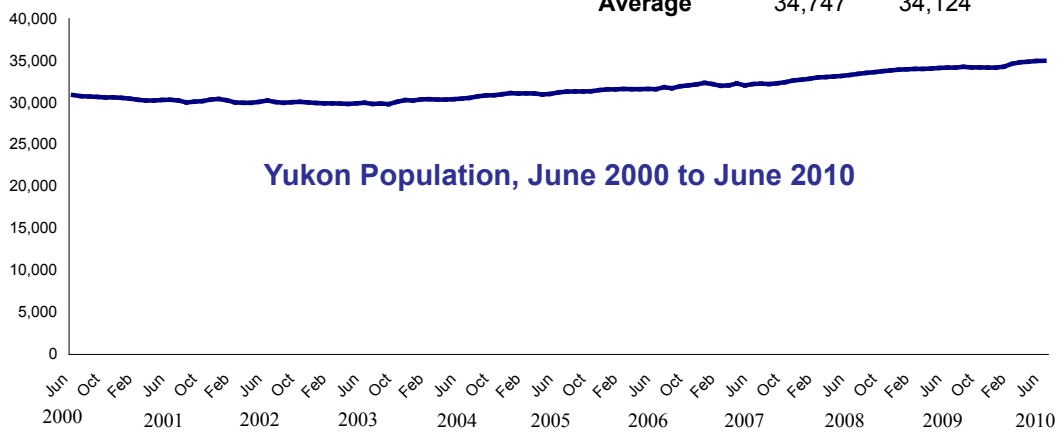


1 Monthly Yukon Population Estimates for 2009 & 2010

- The Yukon's population for June 2010 was 34,984 people. The June 2010 figure is the highest population in recent history for the Yukon¹.
- Between June 2009 and June 2010, the monthly population of the Yukon increased from 34,157 to 34,984, an increase of 827 people, or 2.4%.
- Looking at the last twelve months, the Yukon's population had remained relatively stable July through December 2009, with steady growth each month from January through June in 2010.

¹Accurate population estimates for the gold rush era are not available. However, the first Census population estimate for the Yukon was in 1901 when the population was 27,219.

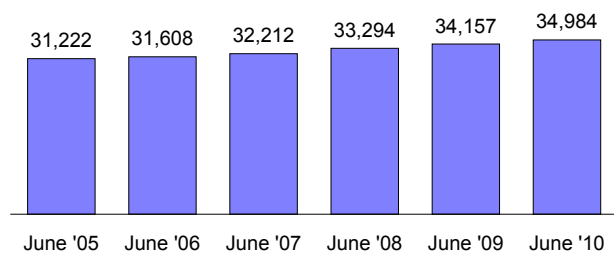

The Yukon's Population In June, 2005 to 2010

As of June 2010, the population of the Yukon was 34,984. This is the seventh consecutive June population increase after six consecutive June decreases following the Faro mine closure in 1997.

- In June 2010, the Yukon's population consisted of 17,804 males (50.9%) and 17,180 females (49.1%).
- There were 5,701 people (16.3%) under 15 years of age, 26,269 (75.1%) between 15 and 64 years of age, and 3,041 people (8.6%) who were 65 years of age or older.

4 Community Populations by Month

Highlights of Population Changes in Yukon's Four Largest Communities

Between June 2009 and June 2010, the Whitehorse population increased by 3.1%. During the same time period, the Dawson City population decreased by 0.7%, the Watson Lake population increased by 0.5%, and the Haines Junction population increased by 3.4%.

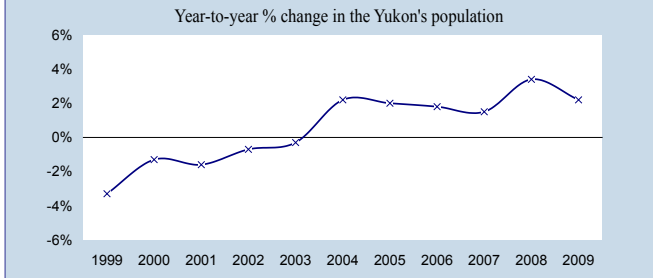

Historical Population Estimates

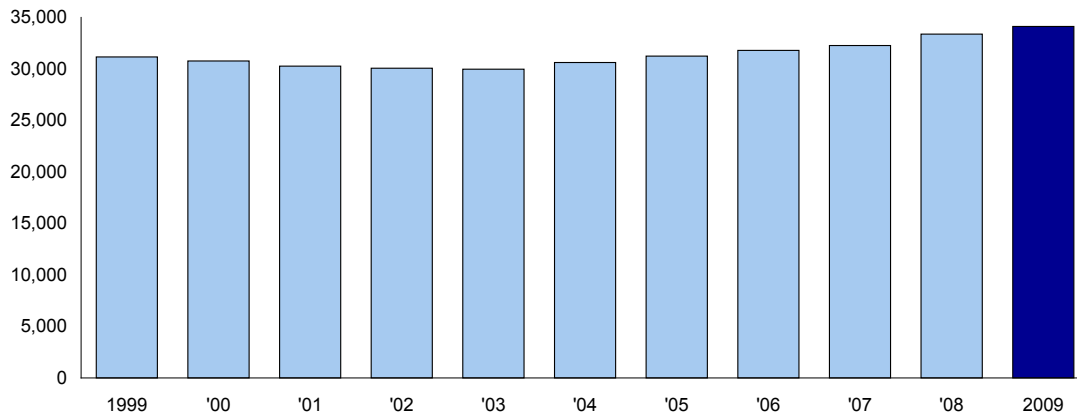
Comparing 1999 to 2009, the annual average population of the Yukon increased by 2,958 people (from 31,166 to 34,124). This represents an annual average growth rate of 0.9%. However, this growth has not occurred evenly from year to year. Rather, it has ranged from a high of 3.4% between '07 and '08 to a low of -1.6% between 2000 and 2001.

Population estimates are used by the public sector, private sector and the general public. The Yukon Bureau of Statistics produces population estimates twice a year. Figures for the months of January to June are released in July of the same year while population estimates for the months of July to December are released in January of the next year.

These population estimates are statistically based on the Yukon Health Care Registration file. The figures are sorted by postal codes and community codes. Users of this information should be aware that the community population includes not only the legally defined city limits, but also the population that lives in the immediately surrounding area. It should also be noted these population estimates do not include approximately 200 RCMP and military personnel living in the Yukon who do not subscribe to the Yukon Health Care Insurance Plan.
