



Population Projections to 2018

IN BRIEF:

Projections for the Yukon's population in 2018 estimate:

- Low-growth: a population of **31,776**; or,
- Medium-growth: a population of **35,107**; or,
- High-growth: a population of **38,606**.

The current population of the Yukon (June 2008) is 33,294.

HOW WILL THE YUKON'S POPULATION CHANGE BY 2018?

Low-growth projection

- Total population would fall by 1,518, or 4.6%.
- The number of Non-Aboriginal people in the Yukon would fall by 1,323, or 5.3%.
- The number of Aboriginal people* in the Yukon would decrease by 195, or 2.4%.
- The number of women in the Yukon would decrease by 352, or 2.1%, while the number of men would decrease by 1,166 or 6.9%.
- Changes in the age distribution of the Yukon show that all age groups 55 and over would increase, as well as the age groups 0-to-4, 5-to-9 and 30-to-34, while the remaining age groups would decrease.

Medium-growth projection

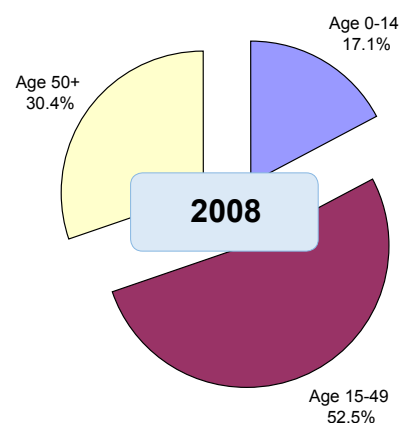
- Total population would increase by 1,813, or 5.4%.
- The number of Non-Aboriginal people in the Yukon would increase by 1,530, or 6.1%.
- The number of Aboriginal people in the Yukon would increase by 283, or 3.5%.
- The number of women in the Yukon would increase by 1,071, or 6.5%, while the number of men would increase by 742, or 4.4%.
- Changes in the age distribution show that all age groups 55+ would increase, while six of eleven age groups below 55 would decrease. The 45-to-49 year-old age group would decrease the most (-26.8%), while the 70-to-74 year-old age group would exhibit the largest increase (101.9%).

High-growth projection

- Total population would increase by 5,312, or 16.0%.
- The number of Non-Aboriginal people in the Yukon would increase by 4,572, or 18.2%.
- The number of Aboriginal people in the Yukon would increase by 740, or 9.1%.
- The number of women in the Yukon would increase by 2,565, or 15.6%, while the number of men would increase by 2,747, or 16.3%.
- Changes in the age distribution of the Yukon show that all age groups 55+ would increase. Five age groups would decrease. The greatest decrease would be in the 45-to-49 year-old age

group (-18.7%). The largest percentage increase would be in the 70-to-74 year-old age group (110.3%).

IMPLICATIONS FOR THE FUTURE



Each projection for the Yukon's population in 2018 shows a larger older population in the Yukon:

- The **low-growth projection** shows the 50+ age groups comprising **37.5%** of the population by 2018; and
- The **medium-growth projection** shows the 50+ age groups comprising **36.4%** of the population by 2018; and
- The **high-growth projection** shows the 50+ age groups comprising **35.4%** of the population by 2018.

* The calculation of Aboriginal people in this publication is based on the percentage of self-identified Aboriginal people reported in the 2006 Census.

LOW-GROWTH POPULATION PROJECTION: Detail

The following tables show the LOW growth projection as it compares to the Yukon's population as of June 2008. Figures are presented by ethnicity (Aboriginal/Non-Aboriginal), by gender and by age. Differences are shown in actual numbers and as percentages.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- Fertility rates are down 10%.
- Mortality rates are constant.
- Net migration each year is -300.

The above table shows changes in the Yukon's Non-Aboriginal population.

- There would be 1,323, or 5.3%, fewer Non-Aboriginal Yukoners in 2018 compared to 2008.
- Most of the decline would be in the 45-to-49 and the 50-to-54 year-old age groups, with all age groups over 60 showing growth.

- Overall, the Aboriginal population would decrease by 195, or 2.4%
- Highest percentage growth would be in the 65-to-69 age group (128.5%), and the largest percentage decline would be in the 40-to-44 age group (-38.0%).

- The table at the bottom of the previous column (low-growth projection for the Yukon's female population) shows that the female population would decline 2.1%, to 16,051, by the year 2018.
- All age groups 55 and over would show growth, with the 70-to-74 age group increasing the most percentage, 90.5%.
- For females under 55, age groups 0-to-4 and 5-to-9, along with 25-to-29 and 30-to-34, would experience an increase in population while the remaining seven age groups would decline.

- The number of male Yukoners would decrease by 1,166, or 6.9%, by the year 2018.
- Only two age groups below 60 would grow (0-to-4 and 5-to-9 year olds), with all age groups 60 and over showing growth.
- The largest percentage decrease would be in the 20-to-24 year-old age group, which would decline by 420 males, or 36.8%.

MEDIUM-GROWTH POPULATION PROJECTION: Detail

- There would be 1,530, or 6.1%, more Non-Aboriginal Yukoners in 2018 compared to 2008.
- The 55 and above age groups show significant increases (a total of 2,591 people).
- The largest decrease, 807 people, would be in the 45-to-49 age group.

- Overall, the Aboriginal population would increase by 283, or 3.5%.
- Highest percentage growth would be in the 65-to-69 age group (134.7%) and the largest percentage decrease would be in the 40-to-44 age group (-32.6%).

- The table at the bottom of the previous column would see the medium-growth projection for the Yukon's female population increase 6.5% to 17,474 by the year 2018.
- All age groups 55 and over would show growth, with the 70-to-74 year-old group increasing the most percentage, 98.4%.
- Six female age groups would decrease: 10-to-14 (-5.6%), 15-to-19 (-18.4%), 20-to-24 (-20.0%), 40-to-44 (-10.3%), 45-to-49 (-30.7%), and 50-to-54 year-olds (-22.7%).

- The number of male Yukoners would increase by 2,747, or 16.3%, by the year 2018.
- Five age groups would decrease: 15-to-19 (-22.5%), 20-to-24 (-21.0%), 40-to-44 (-5.7%), 45-to-49 (-11.9%), and 50-54 (-11.7%).
- The age group with the largest percentage increase would be the 65-to-69 year-olds, increasing by 430 men, or 114.4%.
