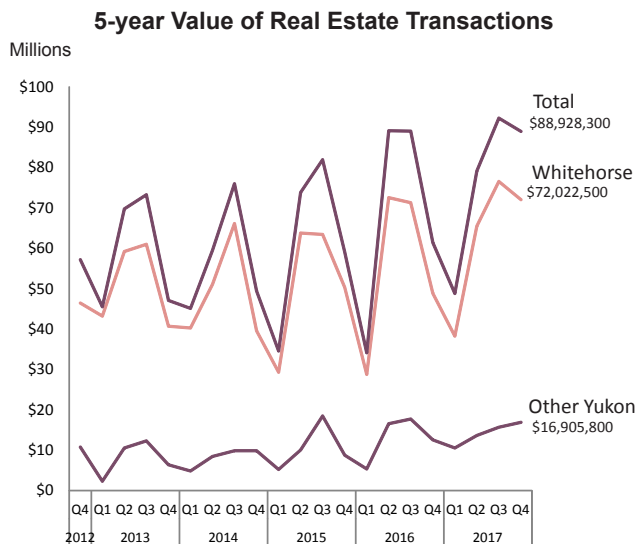
## Yukon Real Estate Survey Fourth Quarter, 2017

### Highlights:

- There were \$88.9 million in real estate transactions in Yukon in the fourth quarter of 2017 consisting of \$72.0 million in Whitehorse and \$16.9 million for the rest of Yukon.
- The average Whitehorse house sale price was \$463,400, a record-high and an increase of \$43,100 from the fourth quarter of 2016.
- The average Whitehorse condo sale price was \$328,600.

Comparing the fourth quarter data of 2017 to that of 2016, there was an increase in the total value of Yukon’s real estate transactions. In the fourth quarter of 2017, the total value of transactions was \$88.9 million (the highest fourth quarter value on record) compared to \$61.4 million in the same period in 2016, an increase of \$27.6 million, or 44.9%.

In Whitehorse in 2017:

- The value of real estate transactions totalled \$252.3 million in 2017 compared to \$221.4 million in 2016, an increase of \$30.9 million, or 14.0%.
- There were 283 single detached house sales, compared to 285 sales in 2016. The average sale price was \$444,400, an increase of \$22,900, or 5.4%, from 2016 (\$421,500).
- A total of 195 condos were sold compared to 174 sales in 2016. The average condo price was \$317,800, an increase of \$8,500, or 2.7%, from 2016 (\$309,300).
- There were 26 mobile home sales in 2017 compared to 35 in 2016. The average mobile home price was \$259,600 in 2017 compared to \$227,400 in 2016.
- In 2017, 49 duplexes were sold compared to 37 in 2016. The average duplex price was \$335,400 in 2017 compared to \$313,900 in 2016.

### About the Yukon Real Estate Survey

The Bureau of Statistics first undertook the Yukon Real Estate Survey in 1977. The survey is a census of all real estate transactions occurring anywhere in Yukon, with the exception of ‘not-at-arm’s-length’ transactions (‘not-at-arm’s-length’ transactions are those that do not reflect open market values). All single and multiple-residential property transactions, as well as commercial and industrial property sales are included.

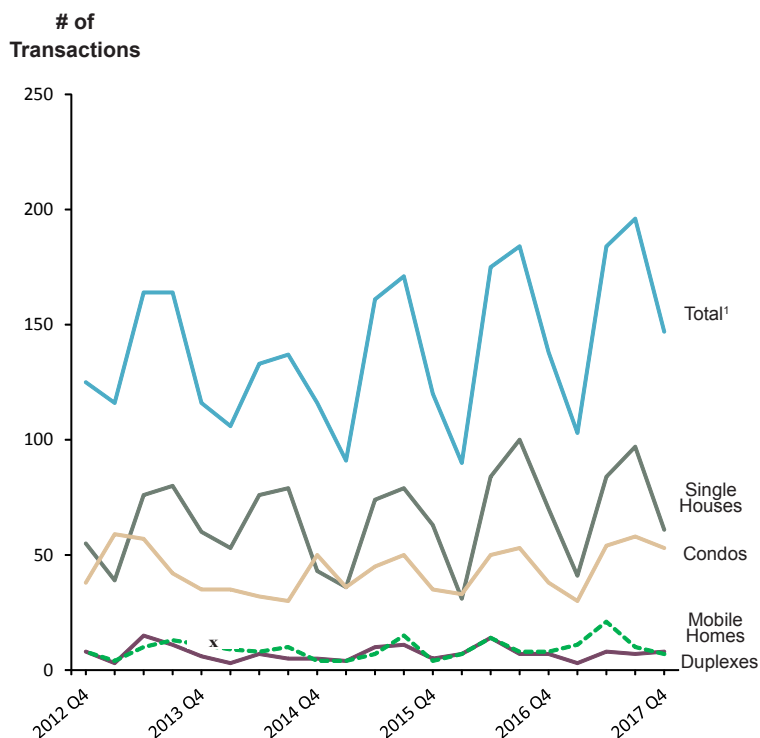

<sup>4</sup> Due to relatively small numbers of sales, especially in the 1<sup>st</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> quarters, there is a fair degree of variability in the average home prices. This should be considered when comparing one quarter to another.

## Number of Real Estate Transactions in Whitehorse (Q4 '12 to Q4 '17)

- In Whitehorse, a total of 147 real estate transactions occurred in the fourth quarter of 2017, an increase of 9 transactions compared to the fourth quarter of 2016. Over the previous five years, the fourth quarter average number of sales was 123.
- There were 61 single houses sold in the fourth quarter of 2017. This number of sales is above the average number of fourth quarter sales (58) in the previous five years.
- The number of condos sold (53) in the fourth quarter of 2017 was well above the average number of fourth quarter sales (39) in the previous five years.
- In the fourth quarter of 2017, seven duplexes were sold in Whitehorse. This figure was slightly above the average number of fourth quarter sales (5) in the previous five years.
- The number of mobile homes sold (8) in the fourth quarter of 2017 was slightly above the average number of fourth quarter sales (6) in the previous five years.

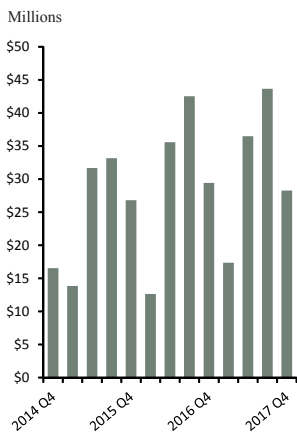

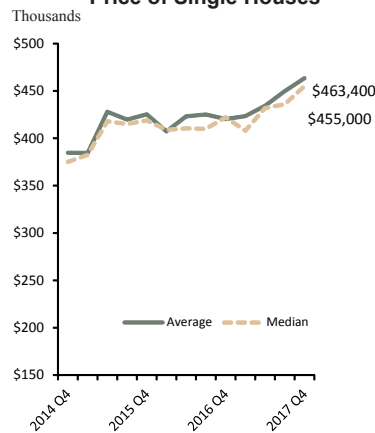

- In the fourth quarter of 2017, 61 single houses were sold in Whitehorse, a decrease of 9 sales compared to the fourth quarter of 2016. The average price was \$463,400 in the fourth quarter of 2017 (a record-high), an increase of \$13,500, or 3.0%, compared to the third quarter of 2017 (\$449,900).
- In Whitehorse, the *median* price of single houses in the fourth quarter was \$455,000, meaning the prices of half the houses sold were above this figure and the remaining half, below.
- Comparing the fourth quarter of 2017 to the fourth quarter of 2014, the average price of single houses in Whitehorse increased 20.5%, while the Consumer Price Index increased 3.7% during this period. This translates into a real increase of 16.7% over the last three years (20.5%-3.7%=16.7%).
- The chartered bank's five year conventional mortgage rate averaged 4.99% in the fourth quarter of 2017, an increase of 0.13 percentage points compared to the third quarter of 2017.

Average and Median Price of Single Houses

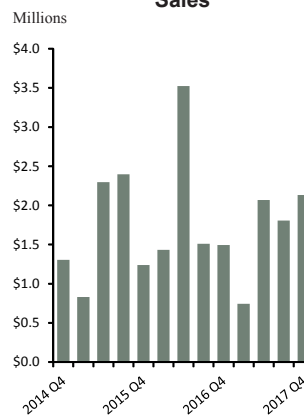


## Mobile Homes<sup>1</sup> in Whitehorse

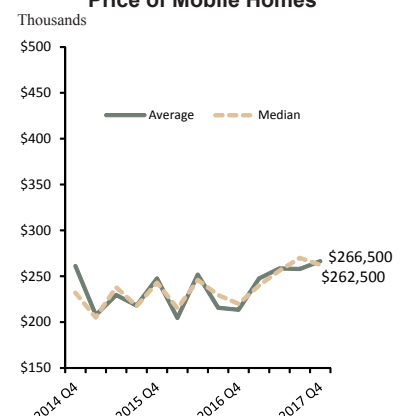
- Eight mobile homes were sold in Whitehorse in the fourth quarter of 2017 with a total transaction value of \$2.1 million, averaging \$266,500. The *median* price of mobile homes was \$262,500.
- The record-high average sale value for mobile homes occurred in the second quarter of 2011 when it reached \$272,800. However, it should be noted that there is a fair bit of volatility in the average sale price of mobile homes due to the relatively small number of sales in any given quarter.

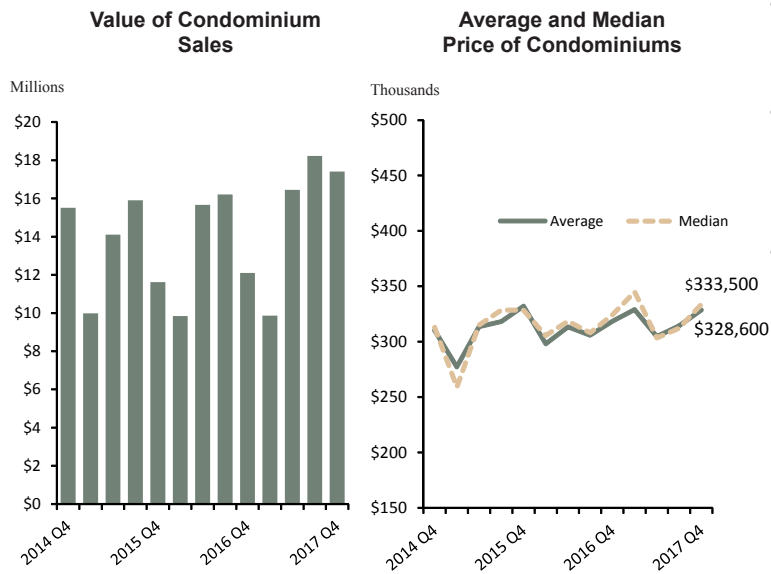
Value of Mobile Home Sales



Average and Median Price of Mobile Homes



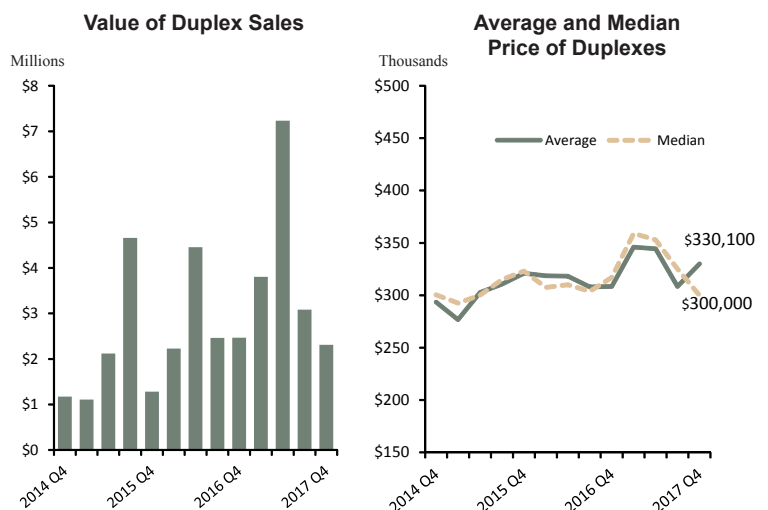
# Condominiums in Whitehorse



- Condo sales in the fourth quarter of 2017 totalled \$17.4 million. The record-high condo sales were in the second quarter of 2012 at \$24.0 million.
- There were 53 condo sales in the fourth quarter of 2017 compared to 58 sales in the third quarter of 2017. The record-high condo sales occurred in the second quarter of 2012 when 80 condos were sold.
- The average condo price was \$328,600 in the fourth quarter of 2017, an increase of \$14,300, or 4.5%, compared to the third quarter of 2017 (\$314,300). The *median* condo price was \$333,500 in the fourth quarter of 2017. *It should be noted that there is a fair bit of volatility in the average and median condo price on a quarterly basis. This is due in part to new condo projects being completed and multiple units being sold at the same or near the same value in one quarter. Depending on the selling prices of these units, this could have a significant effect on the average condo prices.*

# Duplexes<sup>1</sup> in Whitehorse

- Duplex sales in the fourth quarter of 2017 totalled \$2.3 million. The record-high for duplex sales was \$7.7 million, set in the second quarter of 2012.
- There were 7 duplex sales in the fourth quarter of 2017. The record-high number of duplex sales occurred in the second quarter of 2012 when 24 duplexes were sold.
- The average duplex price was \$330,100 in the fourth quarter of 2017 while the *median* price was \$300,000.
