

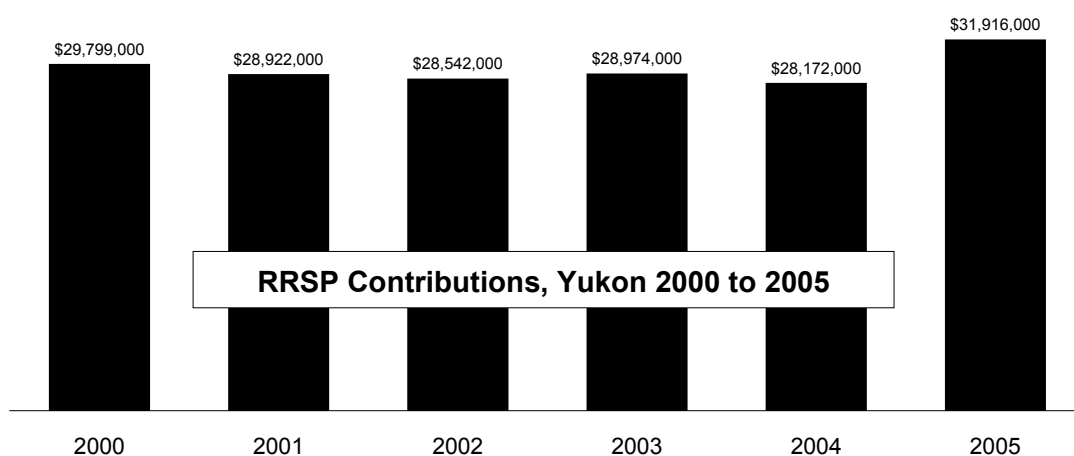

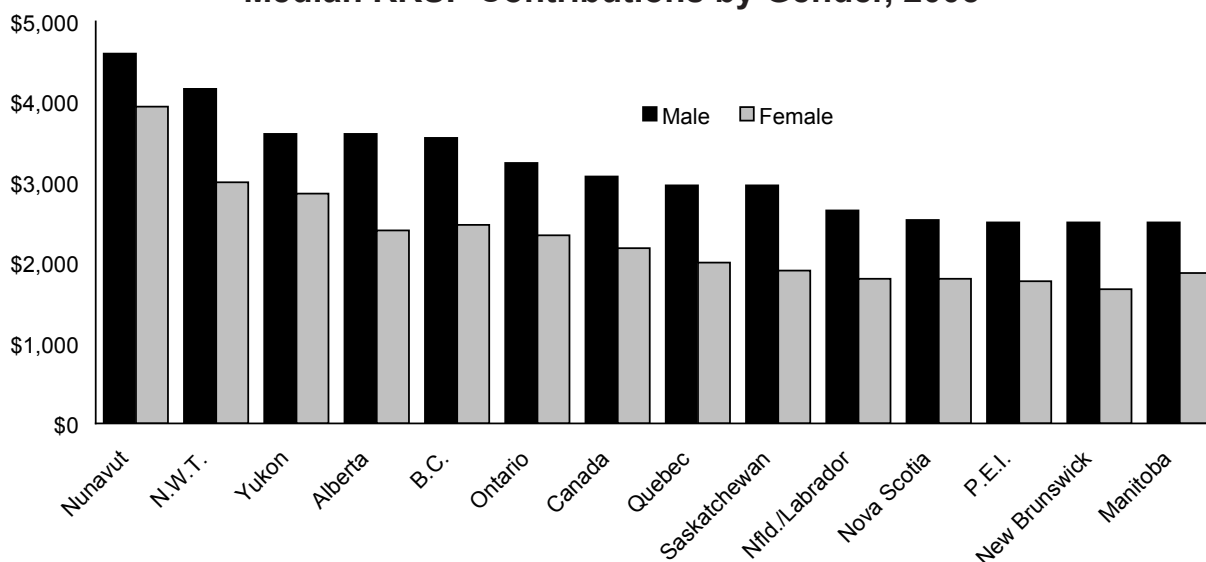
RRSP Contributions 2005

How much did Canadians and Yukoners contribute to RRSPs in 2005?

Canadians contributed \$30.6 billion to registered retirement savings plans (RRSPs) in 2005, up by \$1.8 billion, or 6.2%, from 2004. In 2004, contributions had increased by 4.5% from 2003. The number of Canadians contributing to RRSPs increased in 2005 from 2004. In 2005, 6,135,980 Canadians contributed, up 133,630 or 2.2% from 2004. Yukoners contributed \$31.9 million to RRSPs in 2005, up \$3.7 million, or 13.3%, from 2004. In 2004, Yukon contributions had decreased by 2.8% from 2003. The number of Yukoners contributing to RRSPs was also up in 2005 from 2004. In 2005, 6,020 Yukoners contributed, up 280 or 4.9% from 2004.

What was the median RRSP contribution by an individual in 2005?

Nationally, the median RRSP contribution was \$2,630, up \$30 from 2004. The Yukon recorded the third highest median RRSP contribution (\$3,170). Nunavut reported the highest median contribution at \$4,300 and N.W.T. the second-highest at \$3,490.

Note: The median is the middle point at which half the contribution amounts were higher and half lower.

What were some characteristics of RRSP contributors in 2005?

- ◆ While women in the Yukon represented exactly 50% of the tax-filing population, they accounted for 52% of the number of RRSP contributors and 45% of total dollar contributions for 2005. Compared to Canada and all other provinces and territories, the Yukon recorded the highest proportion of women contributors (52%) and the lowest proportion of male contributors (48%). The Yukon was the only province or territory where female contributors outnumbered males.
- ◆ The median RRSP contribution was higher for men than for women in all provinces and territories.
- ◆ Yukoners closest to retirement (55 to 64) accounted for 18% of the total number of contributors, while comprising 24% of total dollar contributions. Conversely, 20% of contributors were under the age of 35, while their dollar contributions represented 13% of the total. Persons aged 35 to 44 accounted for 26% of the contributors and 23% of the contributions, while those aged 45 to 54 accounted for 33% of the contributors and 37% of the contributions.
- ◆ Nunavut and the N.W.T. had the lowest average age of contributors (41 and 42 years, respectively). The average Canadian RRSP contributor was 44 years of age in 2005, the same as 2004. The Yukon's average age for RRSP contributors was 45 in 2005, up one year from 2004.
- ◆ Nationally, the median employment income for RRSP contributors was \$45,900, an increase of 2.9% over 2004 (\$44,600). The Yukon had the third highest median employment income for RRSP contributors at \$53,400, an increase of \$1,500 or 2.9% from 2004 (\$51,900).
