

Balance-of-trade figures are produced by Statistics Canada and reflect the balance of trade between Yukon and the rest of Canada, and between Yukon and other countries. Yukon production and consumption of both goods and services is shown for each year from 1997 to 2002.

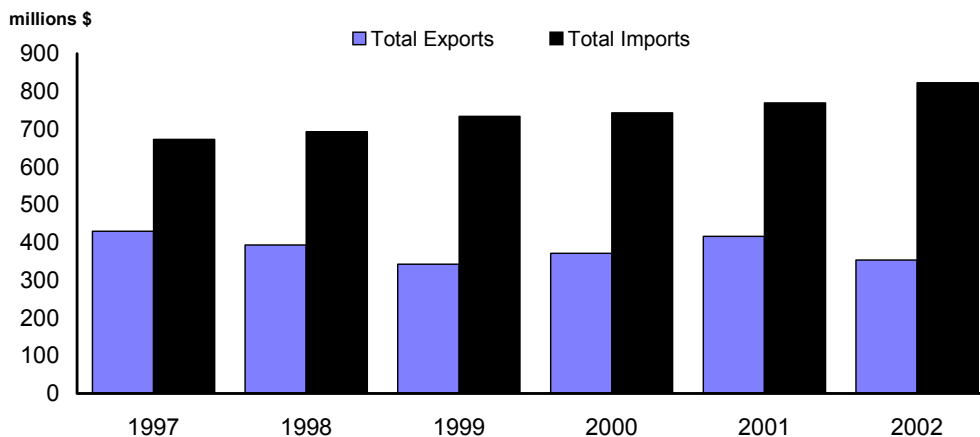

As indicated in the adjacent table, the vast majority of Yukon produced goods and services are consumed within the Yukon. The level of exports fell from 1997 to 1999, then rose through 2001 to \$416.2 million before falling again in 2002 to \$353.2 million. Between 1997, and 2001, exports on average accounted for 18.8% of Yukon goods and services produced. In 2002 exports fell to 15.5% of Yukon goods and services produced. In dollar value, between 1997 and 2001, inter-provincial exports averaged \$185.6 million. Inter-provincial exports in 2002 were slightly above this average at \$192.7 million, while international exports were \$160.5 million. This is well below the 1997 to 2001 average for international exports of \$204.9 million.

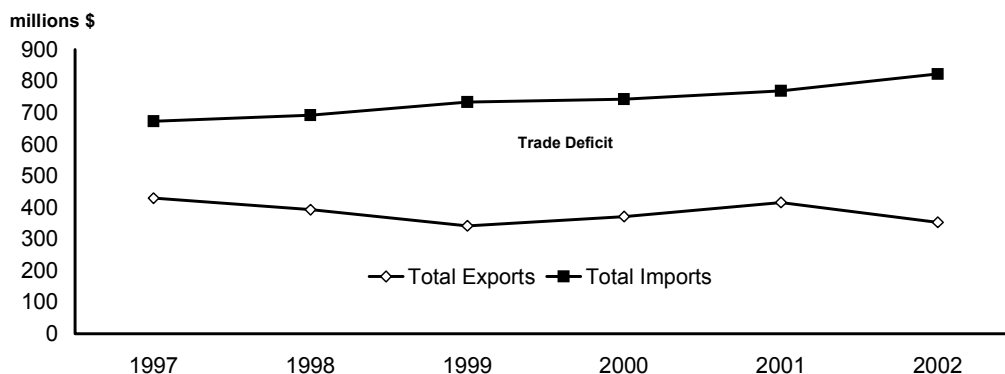

The majority of goods and services consumed in the Yukon are produced in the Yukon. Imports of goods and services as a percentage of total Yukon consumption of goods and services have remained at fairly consistent levels over the years 1997 to 2001, averaging 30.0%. In 2002, imports again accounted for 30.0% of goods and services consumed. Inter-provincial imports make up roughly two-thirds of the total imports to the Yukon, 64.8% in 2002. International imports are about one-third of the total imports, 35.2% in 2002.
