Balance of Trade 1998–2003

Balance-of-trade figures are produced by Statistics Canada and reflect the balance of trade between Yukon and the rest of Canada as well as total Yukon international trade. In this publication, Yukon production and consumption of both goods and services is shown for each year from 1998 to 2003.

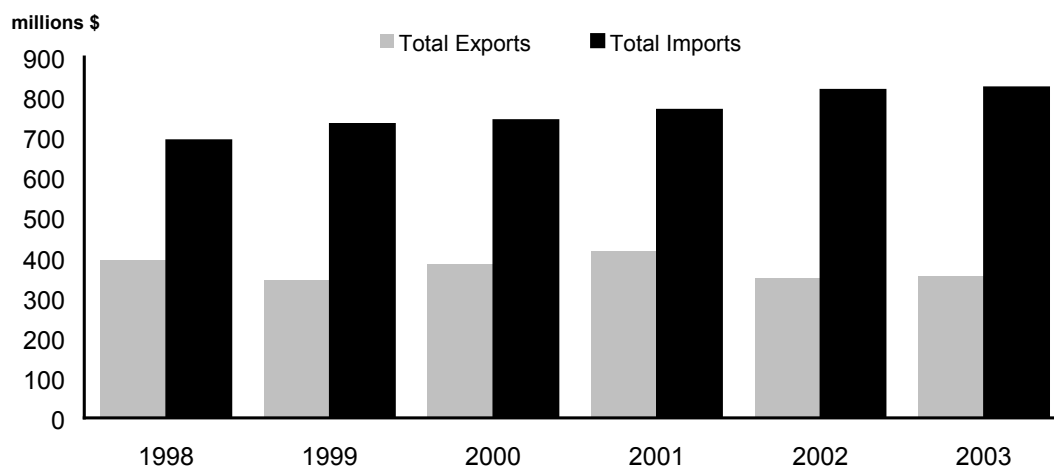

As indicated in the adjacent table, the vast majority of Yukon produced goods and services are consumed within the Yukon. The level of exports fell from 1998 to 1999, then rose through 2001 to \$416.2 million before falling again. In 2003 total exports were at \$353.2 million. Between 1998 and 2002, exports on average accounted for 17.8% of Yukon goods and services produced. In 2003 exports were at 15.6% of Yukon goods and services produced. In dollar value, between 1998 and 2002, inter-provincial exports averaged \$193.6 million. Inter-provincial exports in 2003 were slightly below this average at \$193.2 million, while international exports were \$160.0 million. This is well below the 1998 to 2002 average for international exports of \$183.0 million.

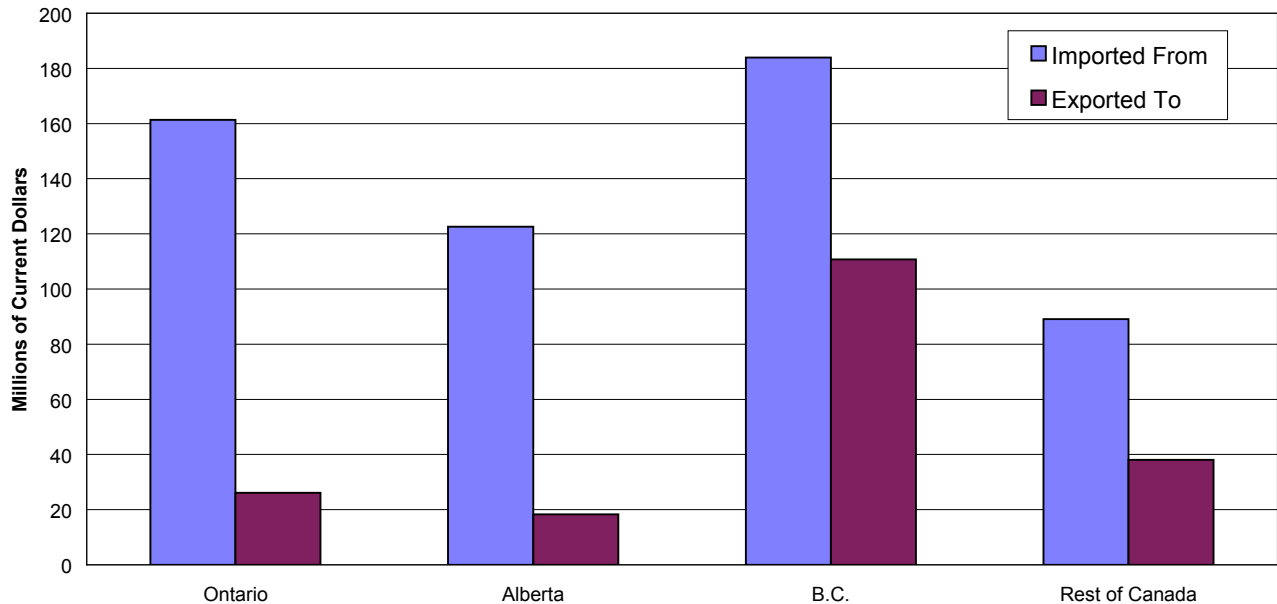

The majority of goods and services consumed in the Yukon are produced in the Yukon. Imports of goods and services as a percentage of total Yukon consumption of goods and services have remained at fairly consistent levels over the years 1998 to 2002, averaging 30.2%. In 2003, imports accounted for 30.1% of goods and services consumed. Inter-provincial imports made up roughly two-thirds of the total imports to the Yukon, 67.5% in 2003. International imports made up the remainder, 32.5%, in 2003.
